Celebrating 150 Years as a Parish: Stories from Our Past

Martin and Patrick Maguire's uncle, Dominick McDevitt, settled in Milford in 1834. One of the first families in Milford and one of its first Irish Catholics, Dominick became a successful road builder and general contractor. In those days, the several dozen Irish Catholics of Milford and Hopkinton trekked to Boston to receive the sacraments. Around 1835, a tragic accident left a deep impression upon Dominick. After suffering fatal injuries on the job, two of Dominick's employees lay near death, while Dominick instinctively ran for a priest to give them the last rites. He returned with Fr. Fitton of East Boston, who a year later celebrated the first Mass in Milford. In the next years, Dominick McDevitt's home on the "Hopkinton" road became a haven for Catholics from Milford, Hopkinton, and miles around. Once a month, Mass was celebrated by Fr. Boyce from Worcester. In between, the families recited their prayers together, spilling onto the hillside when Dominick's house could no longer hold them. Milford needed a church building and a resident priest. Dominick McDevitt helped make that happen. In 1848 he purchased land on East Main St. that he donated for a Catholic church in Milford. The church received its first pastor in 1850. It was later replaced by the present St. Mary's. (*Irish Catholics in Milford 1894*)
