Historic Photos from the 1870's and 1880's

Make sure you check out the historic photos hanging on the walls of the lower church outside the church offices. St. Malachy, Hopkinton's first Catholic church, built in 1851, the first shoe and boot factories on Main Street, Irish-American workers (St. John's first parishioners), the effects of the Great Fire of 1882, St. John the Evangelist as it stood between 1881-1887 without windows, door, or steps, interiorly bare—all and more are represented in enlarged, poster-size photos.

Celebrating 150 Years as a Parish: Stories from Our Past

Irish Catholic immigrants escaping religious persecution and starvation. Heroic priests dedicated to serving them. A small, Puritan town immersed in a booming shoe and boot industry. Increased tensions as Irish workers man the factories and double the town's population. A wooden church, hard won but deteriorating, acquiring a pastor and becoming a parish after 15 years. A young Irish American priest leading a struggling people to build a living monument to their Catholic faith—St. John the Evangelist—but dying before he finishes. This is the story of the origin of our parish. Now that story has been published by *Bespoke History* as a twenty page hardcover book. "The Cathedral in the Woods: The Heroic Beginnings of the Parish of St. John the Evangelist, Hopkinton, Massachusetts," written by the author of "Stories from Our Past," is illustrated with numerous historic photos. Thanks to a generous donation, all proceeds from the book will support the restoration of the upper church. The donors suggest a minimum \$20 donation per copy. Copies of this 150th anniversary souvenir are limited. Available at the back of the church after Mass or in the parish office.
