Our Lady of Mt. Carmel and the Brown Scapular

This past Monday, July 16th, was the memorial of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel (Carmel in Hebrew means "Garden of God"). This feast's day is dated through pious tradition as the day in the 13th century, that Our Lady of Mt. Carmel gave the brown scapular to St. Simon Stock, a Carmelite priest serving in England. St. Simon was exhorted by Our Lady to make available this scapular to the faithful. Our Lady of Mt. Carmel will extend her patronage to the faithful who wear the scapular, especially at one's hour of death. The faithful in turn pledge devotion to Our Lady and the teachings of the Church and to say the rosary daily.

The requirements of this devotion are:

- To receive the imposition of the scapular and to wear it habitually.
- To guard one's chastity.
- To pray daily the Little Office of the Blessed Virgin. It could be substituted by praying three Hail Marys; or seven Our Fathers with Hail Mary and Glory Be; or the Divine Office.

One must be vested by a priest or deacon with the accompanying prayers. For those interested, the vesting of the brown scapular will be available after all the Masses this weekend. For those that currently wear the scapular, one's vesture could be renewed.

First Friday Mass

7PM in the Lower Church

We will have first Friday Masses, in honor of our Lord's Most Sacred Heart, especially for the reparation of sins and sacrileges that so offend our heavenly Father: for our sins; the sins and failures of Church leadership; and for sins of the world. Following the Mass, we will pray the litany to Our Lord's Most Sacred Heart.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament follows the 9AM Mass in the lower church every Friday, beginning with the Litany to our Blessed Mother. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is recited at 11:45AM followed by Benediction. Please feel free to drop in for a visit.

CROSS ROADS

**Genesis 18: 1-10; Psalm 15: 2-5; Colossians 1:24-28;
Luke 10: 38-42**

Today in Genesis it says that the Lord appeared to Abraham, apparently in the form of three strangers, with whom Abraham engaged in conversation and to whom Abraham and his wife, Sarah demonstrated great generosity and welcoming. They are blessed with the promise of a child. In Colossians Saint Paul is rejoicing in his sufferings for the sake of the Body of Christ, the Church: joy in sharing the sufferings of Christ. In Luke's gospel Jesus tells Martha and us what our priority should be: "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her." We are told something by each of these readings about total commitment and being open to the presence of the Lord in our lives, and in other people; and the pure joy and comfort it can bring.

Again, this week we are told to make relationship with the Lord our priority. Let us not be blinded to the Lord in us and in others by our busy lives, our worries and anxieties. Mary chose to sit at the feet of the Lord and to pay attention while Martha was carried away with chores. By the mystery of the Eucharist, we too can be in the physical presence of the Lord. Take some time every week to sit quietly in front of the tabernacle, to offer your total commitment, to open yourself to welcoming the Lord; and listen. When we do this, we learn to live, to love, to serve, and to suffer like Christ, with joy in our hearts; and we become better parents, children, neighbors, friends, etc. Choose the better part! Sit at the feet of the Master!! Then go out and do as he did.




Middle School Youth Group

Important Roe Act Infanticide Bill Update

The Roe Act Infanticide bill could come up for a committee hearing any day now. If passed, The Roe Act would allow all of the following:

- Remove provisions requiring the giving of life saving care of an infant born alive after a failed abortion, legalizing infanticide. (With proper medical care, babies can survive).
- Eliminate the parental consent and notification system entirely, so girls as young as 12 can get abortions without any adult involvement.
- Expand late term abortion through all 9 months with no restrictions.
- Remove requirements that late term abortions be performed in hospitals (many abortion clinics do not have life-saving equipment).

Please take the time to call or write your state legislator and say "No to Roe". Help stop this bill from becoming law in our state and help preserve the sanctity of life.


