Our Lady of Mt. Carmel and the Brown Scapular

July 16th is the memorial of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel (Carmel in Hebrew means “Garden of God”). This feast day is dated through pious tradition as the day in the 13th century, that Our Lady of Mt. Carmel gave the brown scapular to St. Simon Stock, a Carmelite priest serving in England. St. Simon was exhorted by Our Lady to make available this scapular to the faithful.

Our Lady of Mt. Carmel will extend her patronage to the faithful who wear the scapular, especially at one's hour of death. The faithful in turn pledge:

- Devotion to Our Lady and the teachings of the Church,
- To live a chaste life according to one's station in life
- And to say the rosary daily or
- Recite daily the Little Office of the BVM.
- Observe the fasts of Church with abstinence from meat on Fridays.

One must be vested by a priest or deacon with the accompanying prayers.

For those interested, the vesting of the brown scapular of the Carmelites will be available after the Masses **THIS Sunday, July 25**. For those that currently wear the scapular, one's vesture could be renewed.

O my God, in union with the Immaculate Heart of Mary (here kiss the scapular as a sign of your consecration), I offer Thee the Precious Blood of Jesus from all the altars throughout the world, joining with It the offering of my every thought, word and action of this day. O Precious Blood of Jesus, save us! O Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us! O Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us!

CROSS ROADS

**2 Kings4: 42-44; Psalm 145: 10-11, 15-18;
Ephesians 4: 1-6; John 6: 1-15**

Today's gospel highlights the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes. That miracle is the only of Christ's miracles for which there is an account in all four of the gospels. Though they differ in some details, the message is clear: the Lord God always provides sustenance for us at our deepest levels, our deep seeded yearning for something more than this world can offer, that is, to know and to be with God for eternity. We also learn something about what part we each are to play, even though at times we may feel unequal to the task. Today is the beginning of Sundays to come where we will depart from Mark's gospel, to hear from chapter 6 of John's gospel about the mystery of the Eucharist.

Today's readings begin in 2 Kings with Elisha's miracle feeding 100 people with twenty barley loaves (the bread of the poor), and some grain. Yet some was left over. In John's gospel Jesus feeds five thousand with five barley loaves and two fish donated by a boy. Yet twelve wicker baskets were filled with the leftovers. Jesus becomes the perfect fulfillment of Elisha's miracle, and the Lord's promise to provide. The Lord will "...satisfy the desire of every living thing...The LORD is near to all who call on him in truth.": when we call on him humbly, sincerely, and with faith.

There are so many challenges for us in what can be a brutal and upside-down world, including in our own country. Christ's example tells us what we are to do. He fed the hungry. We too must feed the hungry, but not just with food for their bodies. Some people are more than hungry for solace when suffering difficulties, for compassion, friendship, respect, understanding, a helping hand, and encouragement. What can we do about such things? At times everyone has felt unequal to the task. Perhaps that boy with just five barley loaves and two fish, and the apostles felt the same way. The fact is that every little thing that we do adds up and encourages others to do the same. That can especially be true if we as Church respond to Saint Paul's letter to the Ephesians, and his plea for unity. When we live our faith well the Lord gives us the spiritual food that we need. He gives of himself, the Bread of Life. He gives us peace if we accept it. We become part of "one body, one spirit, one Lord who is over all and in all." The Lord God sustains us with what we need, and more, to participate in the work of salvation. Have faith, for the Lord will multiply our relatively meager efforts to heal the divisions in his Church, in our country, and in the world.
