Divine Mercy Prayer Group


There will be a holy hour of Divine Mercy every Monday from 6:30-7:30PM in the lower church. All are welcome.

Archdiocesan Pastoral Planning

You may be wondering about the Archdiocesan pastoral planning process and how it involves St. John's. The Archdiocese, in an effort to maximize the effectiveness of a limited number of priests, has developed a pastoral planning effort titled "Disciples in Mission" which it began to implement in 2012. This plan is not about closing parishes, it is about clergy staffing issues and evangelization. Most parishes will team with one or two other parishes to form an administrative group called a collaborative. Each parish in the collaborative will remain a parish and so retain its own canonical status and financial assets. Each parish will remain its own independent financial unit. One pastor will be assigned to each collaborative. The planning efforts will be spread out over seven phases, with each phase taking about a year to implement. This year has seen the implementation of the third phase of "Disciples in Mission." To date of about 300 parishes or so in the Archdiocese, the planning effort has involved 33 collaboratives and 72 parishes. St. John's will eventually become a collaborative with St. Cecilia's in Ashland. At this time St. John's and St. Cecilia's have not been assigned to a particular phase, but the implementation of our collaborative should be sometime within the next five years. Neither St. John's nor St. Cecilia's will be closing. "Disciples in Mission" has its own website: disciplesinmission.com for those who would like further information. We will keep you posted on any updates from the Archdiocese in regards to their planning efforts.

Celebrating 150 Years as a Parish: Stories from Our Past

At the time of the Centennial Celebration of the Dedication of St. John's in 1989, no one seemed to remember where in Hopkinton the granite for the church had been quarried. No donator was mentioned in news accounts. Mary Cunningham, 1905-2002, knew better. In 1989 she wrote Fr. Degnan to clarify the facts: the granite for the church had come from the backyard of its donator, Grace Gannon, at 33 Ash Street. Mary was disappointed by the response her letter received. Before she died, she made Paul Rattigan, the great-great grandson of Grace Gannon, promise to tell Grace Gannon's story. This is how Paul tells it. "It appears that the parish members of St. John's had great ambitions to build a beautiful stone church, but found they lacked sufficient financial resources to put their plan into action. It was at this point that they approached one of the parishioners, Grace Gannon, in the hope that they might guarry the rock outcropping behind her home for that purpose. Grace consented. She never received, nor did she ask for, any compensation for the stone, or for the disruption of having an active quarry crew and dynamite explosions occurring regularly in her back yard for such an extended period. According to Mary Cunningham, Grace was poor and could have well used any money to help her children, but instead offered to give generously to the benefit of her town and her Church - except for one day. It was Christmas Day, and the Protestant owners of the quarry company had ordered the mostly Catholic crew to put in a full day's work. Seeing this, Grace marched out her back door and ordered the men to leave her property immediately!"

16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing." Martha was caught up in a whirlwind of her own making. She stressed herself out with all the tasks and chores she thought she had to do to host Jesus, but Jesus wasn't the one who expected all of that. He just wanted Martha's presence, her company and friendship. His only expectation was that Martha would prepare for him her heart, but she was fixated on preparing her home instead. How often do we create a similar whirlwind in our lives? How often do we fixate on external details, on making a good impression, on having all appearances looking just so, but forget what really matters? How often do we make ourselves "anxious and worried" about all we think we have to do? In today's Gospel Jesus calls us to stop the frenetic activity of our lives, to pause and listen, imitating Mary "who sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak. "This can seem impossible. We look at our calendars and our to-do lists and cannot find a single slot in which to squeeze quiet prayer or silent spiritual listening. But Jesus asks us to reorganize our priorities. He tells us, "There is need of only one thing." Really, Jesus? Have you seen our lists!? What can we possibly eliminate? Don't we need to do all of this? The Lord says no. What we need to do is to make time to be with him. The same Lord who turned water into wine and fed five thousand men with five loaves of bread and two fish can also multiply our time. So instead of being like Martha who tried to tell Jesus what to do-"Tell her to help me"-let's be like Mary who listened to what Jesus had to say
