
ELECTRONIC GIVING

CROSS ROADS

Deuteronomy 4:32-34, 39-40; Psalm 33:4-6, 9, 18-20, 22; Romans 8:14-17; Matthew 28:16-20

As Roman Catholic Christians we have been baptized in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holv Spirit. When we were baptized we professed (on our own, or through our parents and Godparents) belief in our triune (three in one) God. We do so at Mass every time we say the Creed, and every time we re-state our Baptismal vows. The mystery of the oneness and indivisible unity of this triune God is not understandable through reason alone. Nor is the concept of the all-powerful, all-present, all-knowing, all-loving God who always was and always will be (unfettered by time, space, nature, or anything else) understandable by reason alone. All we know is that God must be all these things (and more), or he would not be God. Reason must be informed by the infinite love of the Father, the salvific redemption of the Son (the Word of God), and the inspirational promptings and intercession of the Spirit, acting through the tradition of the Holy Church (so richly stated in the Catechism among other sources). It is only by such things and the gift of faith that we come to understand, despite our limitations, just enough to believe, and to act on that belief. And what do we believe? We believe in God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; and that they are one in a unity of love and substance that is indivisible. God is Love, and that Love is expressed through Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Allow your reason to be informed by your faith in these truths. Allow yourself to dwell in this triune God, and He in you.
