# Fr. Henault Visit

Fr. John Henault of the Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate will be celebrating Mass with us THIS Sunday, August 19, at 10AM. The Mission Apostolate group here at St. John's has worked with Father Henault for many years. We invite you to join us in celebrating Mass and also invite you afterward to the lower church to catch up with Fr. John. Father Henault's latest project in Gonaives, Haiti is to outfit the St. Damian Clinic he started to treat people who have Hansen's Disease (leprosy). So far, the new clinic has completed treatment on 121 patients and currently has 21 patients who are actively being treated. In order to make the clinic more self-sufficient, there is need to purchase a blood analyzer, centrifuge, rotator, auto clave and other necessary medical and laboratory equipment in addition to the need to hire a full-time technician to run the equipment and perform the testing. Additionally, the clinic will make this testing capability available to the Sisters of Charity hospice nearby who must currently send out specimens for testing to a distant laboratory at great cost. At the young age of 82, father continues to assist local residents and act as chaplain for the local Sisters of Charity that work with terminally ill patients. The funds that we at St. John's send, help fulfill Christ's work of compassion for and healing of the sick while spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ in the Gospel. # **CROSS ROADS**

Proverbs 9: 1-6; Psalm 34: 2-7; Ephesians 5: 15-20; John 6: 51-58

Today Saint Paul, as usual, gets right to the heart of the matter. To paraphrase, he tells the people of his time that they live in evil times. He tells them to forsake ignorance, and to try to understand the Lord's will. He tells them not to be involved in drunkenness, because it often leads to other problems. We too, all of us on this planet, live in the midst of evil (whether it be abortion, crime, soft or hard persecution of Christianity, genocide, human trafficking, etc.). We too need to take Paul's direction to heart.

So, let me be blunt. Ignorance can be cured by study. We each have a responsibility to educate ourselves: take time to read the Catechism and Holy Scripture. Do not dull your senses with worldly excesses that can hurt you (body mind and soul), make you less receptive to the Holy Spirit, and thereby make it more difficult to understand the Lord's will for you. Instead make room for the Spirit and His gift of wisdom; discern what the Lord wants you to do; pray; sit before the Blessed Sacrament; pray the Rosary; give praise and thanks to God for everything.

Most crucial of all, Jesus promised that, if you eat His body and drink his blood, you will remain in Him, and He in you. The Eucharist will strengthen and heal you; and fill you with the Holy Spirit. You will be able to say with the psalmist, "I sought the Lord, and he answered me and delivered me from all my fears." Our eternity is at stake. For all of us, including me, it would be **wise** to do what the Lord and Paul tell us to do.
