## WEDNESDAY EVENING ROSARY



## First Friday Masses in Honor of the Sacred Heart And Spiritual Reparation

**7PM** in the Lower Church

Why?: To make reparation for the sins of the clergy and failures in Church leadership; to pray for the spiritual healing of those that have been hurt; to deepen our own relationship to Our Savior through His most Sacred Heart.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart, as we know it, began about the year 1672. On repeated occasions, Jesus appeared to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, a Visitation nun, in France, and during these apparitions He explained to her the devotion to His Sacred Heart as He wanted people to practice it. He asked to be honored in the symbol of His Heart of flesh. Our Lord asked for acts of reparation, Communion on the First Friday of the month, and the keeping of the Holy Hour.

When the Catholic Church approved the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, She did not base Her action only on the visions of Saint Margaret Mary. The Church approved the devotion on its own merits. There is only one Person in Jesus, and that Person was at the same time God and Man. His Heart, too, is Divine -- it is the Heart of God.

We will have first Friday Masses, in honor of our Lord's Most Sacred Heart, especially for the reparation of sins and sacrileges that so offend our heavenly Father: for our sins; the sins of the Church; and sins of the world. Following the Mass, we will pray the litany to Our Lord's Most Sacred Heart.

## CROSS ROADS By Deacon Tony Isaiah 35: 4-7; Psalm 146: 6-10: James 2: 1-5; Mark 7: 31-37

The Lord reigns in eternity, in timelessness. Yet he interacts with us in time. He became the Word Made Flesh. When he walked the Earth, Jesus spent most of his time with those in need: the poor, the blind, the mute, the fearful, the lame, the weak, the sinful, the oppressed, the meek. That is why we believe that the Lord continues to interact with us in time, through the Eucharist, through the sacraments, through all of us in the Mystical Body of Christ who are open to the possibilities. The Lord in his mercy gives us time to cooperate with his grace in this age of salvation.

The Lord wants us to love as he loves, to be impartial in the good that we do in his name. He is with all of us, because if there is one thing about the human condition, no matter how well off we may seem, whether we realize it or not we all suffer. We all have infirmities of body, mind and soul. We all need healing. The healing and consolation we receive from the Lord, with his help, we can pass on to others.

It was said of Jesus that "He has done all things well." Can that be said of us? Unlikely, because we are not perfect; but we can imitate the example that Jesus gives us. We must pray, make frequent use of the sacraments, be poor in spirit, simplify, refrain from making distinctions among ourselves, in word and deed treat others as we want to be treated, allow the Lord to remove our individual impediments, and use our gifts for good. As Jesus said to the deaf man in today's gospel. "Be Opened!"

## St. Michael the Archangel Prayer

The St. Michael the Archangel Prayer, which was prayed for decades after every Mass throughout the Catholic world, up until 1964, will be resumed at St. John's after all the Masses: the spiritual and moral renewal of the Church warrants it. The prayer reminds us that there is an intelligent force of evil we call Satan or the Devil that actively seeks the ruin of souls (1Peter 5:8). This prayer, composed by Pope Leo XIII, also reminds us that spiritual warfare is a part of our Christian journey and further reminds us of our duty to engage in this essential struggle.

We also make an appeal to the Sacred Heart of our Lord and to the Immaculate Heart of Mary for special help and protection, as well as an invocation to St. Joseph, the patron saint of the universal Church.
