#### **CROSS ROADS**

Sirach 3:2-6,12-14 Or 1 Samuel 1:20-22,24-28; Psalm 128:1-5 Or Psalm 84:2-3,5-6,9-10; Colossians 3:12-21 Or 1 John 3:1-2,21-24; Luke 2: 41-52



There is a rich multiple choice of first and second readings, and Psalms today; but one Gospel. Yet, in the context of today's Gospel, all the readings are saying the same thing in different ways: we are called to holiness as individuals, as families, and as Church. A holy family is centered on Christ, filled with compassion, humility, gentleness, patience, mutual respect and reverence between husband and wife, children and parents. Husbands and wives, parents and children, brothers and sisters do not possess each other. We all belong to God, and as individuals and families our purpose

is to assist one another to discern what God intends for each of us: and to let it be.

After the Passover celebration, Mary and Joseph suffered the anxiety of having to look for their son for three days. When they found the twelve-year-old Jesus, they heard his puzzling answer to Mary's questioning why Jesus did this. She kept that experience in her heart; and Jesus obediently returned with them to "advance in wisdom and age and favor before the Lord and Man." Many years later Mary would face another Passover with her son and suffer losing him again for three days until his Resurrection. Don't we all occasionally lose Jesus as individuals and families only to find him again in Holy Mother Church and in each other?

This is important for us as families and as individuals; but also important to us as Church. Sister Lucia of Fatima revealed to the late Cardinal Caffarra that "the final battle between the Lord and the reign of Satan will be about marriage and family." Saint Pope John Paul II said "As the family goes, so goes the nation, and so goes the whole world..." Perhaps, as others have said, "as the family goes, so goes the Church." I think we are living this reality here and now. Help each other to advance in wisdom and favor before the Lord. Be holy. Be family. Be Church.

# First Friday Masses in Honor of the Sacred Heart And Spiritual Reparation

#### Friday, January 4 at 7PM in the Lower Church

Why?: To make reparation for the sins of the clergy and failures in Church leadership; to pray for the spiritual healing of those that have been hurt; to deepen our own relationship to Our Savior through His most Sacred Heart.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart, as we know it, began about the year 1672. On repeated occasions, Jesus appeared to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, a Visitation nun, in France, and during these apparitions He explained to her the devotion to His Sacred Heart as He wanted people to practice it. He asked to be honored in the symbol of His Heart of flesh. Our Lord asked for acts of reparation, Communion on the First Friday of the month, and the keeping of the Holy Hour.

When the Catholic Church approved the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, She did not base Her action only on the visions of Saint Margaret Mary. The Church approved the devotion on its own merits. There is only one Person in Jesus, and that Person was at the same time God and Man. His Heart, too, is Divine -- it is the Heart of God.

We will have first Friday Masses, in honor of our Lord's Most Sacred Heart, especially for the reparation of sins and sacrileges that so offend our heavenly Father: for our sins; the sins of the Church; and sins of the world. Following the Mass, we will pray the litany to Our Lord's Most Sacred Heart.

#### St. Michael the Archangel Prayer

The St. Michael the Archangel Prayer, which was prayed for decades after every Mass throughout the Catholic world, up until 1964, will be resumed at St. John's after all the Masses: the spiritual and moral renewal of the Church warrants it. The prayer reminds us that there is an intelligent force of evil we call Satan or the Devil that actively seeks the ruin of souls (1Peter 5:8). This prayer, composed by Pope Leo XIII, also reminds us that spiritual warfare is a part of our Christian journey and further reminds us of our duty to engage in this essential struggle. We also make an appeal to the Sacred Heart of our Lord and to the Immaculate Heart of Mary for special help and protection, as well as an invocation to St. Joseph, the patron saint of the universal Church.
