Carol Zani to Retire

After thirty years serving as Religious Education Director at St. John's parish, Carol Zani will retire at the end of May. Carol was first hired by Fr. James Degnan in 1989 as director of Grades 1-8 alongside Father Michael Alfano who directed Grades 9-10 at the time. Previously, Carol served as director of Grades 1-10 at St. Cecilia's parish in Ashland for seven years. Carol also taught part-time at Center and Elmwood Schools as a Health Education teacher for 21 years before retiring from teaching in 2008. She also worked as education consultant for twenty-five years for Wm. Sadlier Publishing, NYC, the company that produces the religion series we use in our programs. Carol was born and raised in Hopkinton and received all her sacraments at St. John's. She has four children who also received their sacraments here. Prior to becoming a DRE, Carol was a volunteer catechist for many years beginning with her senior year in college, and taught in most of the grades while her children were growing up, before becoming a catechetical leader. During that time, she attended the archdiocesan Master Teacher Program & RCIA training at Aquinas College, and took courses at St. John's Seminary Master of Arts in Ministry, Pope St. John Seminary and Boston College School of Theology & Ministry as well as attending many workshops and conferences. She remembers teaching many of the parents whose children have been in our classes through the years. She looks forward to the change of pace that retirement brings and is excited about life as a retiree and volunteering in her home parish. Carol will be greatly missed and we wish her all the best in her retirement.

CROSS ROADS By Deacon Tony

Nehemiah 8: 2-6, 8-10; Psalm 19: 8-10, 15; 1Corinthians 12: 12-30; Luke 1: 1-4; 4: 14-21

In Ezra's time (after the long Babylonian captivity), the task was to rebuild Jerusalem, and to re-commit the people to the law in Scripture. Having done much rebuilding, Ezra turned his attention to the people. One day, he read to them all morning from the book of the law. The people listened attentively, and with great reverence. In contrast, Jesus came to save souls. He came not to rebuild the infrastructure of Jerusalem, but to build a new Jerusalem, the Church, made of "living stones" (the faithful and their many gifts) with Jesus as the head. This new Jerusalem would be eternal.

In Luke's gospel, Jesus returned to Nazareth "in the power of the Spirit." On the Sabbath, Jesus read a short passage from Isaiah about the one who was to come with the Spirit upon him. Then, with all eyes looking intently at him, Jesus gave a one sentence homily: "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." Thus, he proclaimed himself to be the fulfilment of the law. Reading on in Luke, we see that those present soon turned on Jesus and wanted to kill him, judging that he had overstepped his bounds. They could not see the truth that was standing in front of them.

All our collective gifts complement one another. We are to use them for the good of all, and to stand up for what is lawful, right and just so that the new Jerusalem is a light to the world. In Romans 12: 1-2 Saint Paul says, "Do not conform yourselves to this age...so that you may judge what is God's will..." If we do so we will travel roads that are pleasing to God, good for his Church and for our own salvation. As we see what happened to Jesus in his home town, however, every such road has its obstacles and crosses. Pray for the light to see our gifts, and for the courage to use them.

St. Michael the Archangel Prayer

We also make an appeal to the Sacred Heart of our Lord and to the Immaculate Heart of Mary for special help and protection, as well as an invocation to St. Joseph, the patron saint of the universal Church.
