CROSS ROADS

Isaiah 60: 1-6; Psalm 72: 1-2, 7-8, 10-13; Ephesians 3: 2-3, 5-6; Matthew 2: 1-12

What is an epiphany? It is a manifestation, a revelation, a sudden and striking understanding of something. For a savior, Israel was expecting a conquering hero, somebody who would come in glory to restore the greatness of the secular kingdom of Israel. Instead, The Christ came in the most humble, vulnerable, lovable and approachable form he could. Not many of us are immune to the peace and joy that comes with beholding such a little one.

From his birth, Jesus was heralded and revealed as the Savior. He was revealed to poor shepherds, and to the Magi (who were Gentiles). Both the Shepherds and the Magi came to visit, and to worship. They believed and found hope for good will, justice and peace in the Christ Child. It was Israel that was meant to be a light to the rest of the world that the Savior had come. It was later that the Apostles realized that it was the Church that was to be the new Israel that would reveal Christ to the world. They did so by what they said, by how they lived, and by how they died. Contrast the reaction of Herod The Great. He did not believe. As a result, he was troubled and angry at the mere thought that there might be a rival to his secular throne. His thoughts were of treachery and murder.

I am writing this on December 28, 2018, the Feast of the Martyrdom of the Holy Innocents, the consequence of Herod's lack of faith, selfishness and lust for holding on to power. Those were dark days indeed! We also live in dark days. Tendencies toward a lack of faith, toward making human beings and governments a kind of god, and toward not accepting any kind of objective right or wrong prevail. It is a time when the murder of some sixty million unborn children in the United States alone is tolerated. It is a time when anyone who expresses beliefs in Christian moral teachings that disagree with the tyranny of secularist, relativist doctrines and policies can be subjected to ridicule, character assassination, harassment, and physical harm to their property and persons. We are bitterly challenged in our own time!

Considering how Jesus, the Holy Innocents, and the Apostles lived and died; as the New Israel, how are we revealing Christ our Savior to our families, communities, country, and the world?

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament follows the 9AM Mass in the lower church every Friday, beginning with the Litany to our Blessed Mother. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is recited at 11:45AM followed by Benediction.

St. Michael the Archangel Prayer
