CROSS ROADS By Deacon Tony Jeremiah 17: 5-8; Psalm 1: 1-4, 6; 1 Corinthians 15: 12, 16-20; Luke 6: 17, 20-26

Today's readings remind us we are called to give our entire beings lovingly to the Lord. Thus, we are called to be Christlike. Today's readings are a basic blueprint of how to be Christlike, and how to live lives that are truly happy here, but which prepare us for eternal happiness with the Lord, in effect, how to become saints. Even if not canonized, we are called to be saints none the less.

Trust in the Lord solidly roots us to the spiritual nourishment we need to be as free as possible from fear and distress, even in the face of worldly problems. Delight in, and adherence to the law of the Lord fortifies us and gives us the nourishment to be fruitful. Faith in the life, death, and resurrection of Christ opens the door of our hearts to the salvation Christ won for us so that we may be raised to be with him. The Beatitudes in today's gospel are a warning that love of, and attachment to the things of this world is futile. Such attachments can damage our attachment to the love of God, the love that opens us up to the plight of those who suffer from want, persecution, ridicule, and to the possibility of being ridiculed and persecuted ourselves for our faith.

Consider how Christ lived. Christ gave up everything for us, including his life. We are called to give everything to him. Consider also how saints live and die, what they do, what they say, how they pray, how they care for others, what they give up, and at times what they suffer. The Lord wants each of us to be happy in earthly life, but not to be so attached to it that we ignore the things we need to do to be happy with him in eternity. Lent begins in a little over two weeks from now. We must consider what each of us needs to do, and what attachments each of us needs to break to be more and more Christlike. As is often said on EWTN radio. "Be a saint. What else is there?"

St. Michael the Archangel Prayer
