

CROSS ROADS

Deuteronomy 26: 4-10; Psalm 91: 1-2, 10-15; Romans 10: 8-13; Luke 4: 1-3

Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit went into the desert for forty days, where he would pray and fast. He would be tempted to abandon his mission, the salvation of mankind. Jesus resisted, and rebuked the devil. Lent is forty days, and we too are prompted by the Spirit to enter our own desert for detachment from the things of this world, for repentance, prayer, fasting, and self-discipline. We too are tempted to abandon our Baptismal mission to renounce Satan and his empty promises; and to love and serve the Lord by loving and serving one another

It is written that the devil departed from Jesus "...for a time." That implies that the devil will be back at some point for another try, perhaps when Jesus was abandoned by his disciples, or during the horrible agonies that would follow his arrest. The devil will return for us as well, when we are feeling weak, distressed, lonely, in pain, tired, fearful, over confident, or prideful. But todays readings tell us of the times the Lord has saved his people from affliction, and oppression. They tell us that if we hope and trust in the Lord, as Jesus did, and if we proclaim Jesus as Lord, and believe in his resurrection, we can be freed from sin's oppression.

Don't be discouraged by lapses, failures and weakness. Trust in the graces of the Sacraments of Penance and the Eucharist. Use them. "When I am powerless, it is then that I am strong" (2 Corinthians 12: 10). While following other Lenten observances, also "...put your gifts at the service of one another, each in the measure he has received" (1 Peter 4: 10). Let us persevere in our mission.
