CROSS ROADS

Genesis 15: 5-12, 17-18; Psalm 27: 1, 7-9, 13-14; Philippians 3: 17-4:1; Luke 9: 28-36

God made a covenant with Adam and Eve, and it was broken by humanity. God made a covenant with Abram, which over time was broken as well. God made other covenants with humanity through the centuries, all of which were broken by mankind. God reveals himself in Christ's life, death, and resurrection as being filled with so much love for us, that **he** *is* **love**. As God and man, Christ fulfills the covenant for us. Through Christ, *God friended* us forever.

However, Saint Paul reminds us today that we must be courageous and steadfast in following Christ, and in carrying our own crosses with love and patience. Paul reminds us that we are destined for another life, a heavenly one. He warns us against attachment and preoccupation with the things of this world. In other words, we must imitate Christ, the saints who have gone before us, and the saints among us; not the worldly influences that turn us away from our crosses and from Christ.

In the transfiguration in today's gospel, God reveals Christ's divine nature. The transfiguration also gives us a hint of how we will be transformed to live forever with God (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit). Lent is a good time for us to train ourselves for living lives that fulfill that destiny. There is one more thing. At the transfiguration, God gave us a command: "This is my chosen son; **listen to him**." I think it best to obey that one, don't you?
