# First Friday Masses in Honor of the Sacred Heart And Spiritual Reparation

Friday, June 7 at 7PM in the Lower Church

Why?: To make reparation for our sins, the sins and failures of Church leadership; and for the sins of the world; to pray for the spiritual healing of those that have been hurt; to deepen our own relationship to Our Savior through His most Sacred Heart.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart, as we know it, began about the year 1672. On repeated occasions, Jesus appeared to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, a Visitation nun, in France, and during these apparitions He explained to her the devotion to His Sacred Heart as He wanted people to practice it. He asked to be honored in the symbol of His Heart of flesh. Our Lord asked for acts of reparation, Communion on the First Friday of the month, and the keeping of the Holy Hour.

When the Catholic Church approved the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, She did not base Her action only on the visions of Saint Margaret Mary. The Church approved the devotion on its own merits. There is only one Person in Jesus, and that Person was at the same time God and Man. His Heart, too, is Divine -- it is the Heart of God.

We will have first Friday Masses, in honor of our Lord's Most Sacred Heart, especially for the reparation of sins and sacrileges that so offend our heavenly Father: for our sins; the sins of the Church; and sins of the world. Following the Mass, we will pray the litany to Our Lord's Most Sacred Heart.

## **CROSS ROADS**

Acts 7:55-60; Psalm 97:1-2,6-7, 9; Revelation 22:12-14,16-17,20; John 17:20-27

Prayer is communication with God. Stephen, the first martyr, saw a vision, and he prayed by proclaiming what he saw, the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of God. He was martyred for that proclamation. While being stoned to death, Stephen prayed asking Jesus to receive his spirit. As he died, Stephen prayed that his persecutors be forgiven. Today's Psalm is a prayer of praising and glorifying God, "You, O Lord, are Most High over all the earth..." John's vision in today's reading from Revelation ends with a prayer, "Amen! Come Lord Jesus!" We were made part of today's Gospel when Jesus prayed to the Father for his apostles and "...not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, "...so that they all may be one..." and "I wish that where I am they also may be with me..."

We can pray by directly speaking to God, by proclaiming the truth, and by everything we say and do. I heard it said on EWTN that we should not make prayer a form of work. Rather, we should make work part of our prayer. There is a message for us in all of this: through the ages, Jesus continues his redemptive work through us. He calls all of us in different ways. St. Teresa of Calcutta said, "I used to believe that prayer changes things. But now I know that prayer changes us, and we change things." LET US PRAY!



## Important Roe Act Infanticide Bill Update

The Roe Act Infanticide bill could come up for a committee hearing any day now. If passed, The Roe Act would allow all of the following:

- Remove provisions requiring the giving of life saving care of an infant born alive after a failed abortion, legalizing infanticide. (With proper medical care, babies can survive).
- Eliminate the parental consent and notification system entirely, so girls as young as 12 can get abortions without any adult involvement.
- Expand late term abortion through all 9 months with no restrictions.
- Remove requirements that late term abortions be performed in hospitals (many abortion clinics do not have lifesaving equipment).

Please take the time to call or write your state legislator and say "No to Roe". Help stop this bill from becoming law in our state and help preserve the sanctity of life.
