It's time to recycle all those old electronics! All towns welcome. No resident requirement. Clean out your basement or garage and bring your items to the church parking lot! The following is a list of recyclable items, including, but not limited to: computer towers, laptops, VCRs, copiers, DVDs, stereo equipment, microwaves, dehumidifiers, radios, small electronics of any kind, lighting, vacuums, any appliance such as stoves, washers, dryers, etc. Exercise equipment, lawn mowers, snow blowers, small engine items, empty propane tanks--\$10. TVs up to 18"--\$15 each; TVs 19" to 24"--\$20 each; TVs 25" to 31"--\$25 each; TVs 32" to 35"--\$30 each; TVs 36" and larger, wood console, and projection TVs--\$40 each. Proverbs 8: 22-31; Psalm 8: 4-9; Romans 5: 1-5; John 16: 12-15

"Deus Caritas Est." God is Love. God is so much love that, in and of himself, he is a family (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit). His love is so profound that it is unfathomable. God is so much love that his love overflows into the immensity of creation. With all we know about this earth and the universe, we have barely scratched the surface of what there is to know. The same is true of our knowledge of God. His love is so great for humanity, that his Word was made flesh by the power of the Holy Spirit in the person of Jesus, the image of the living God, whose life, death and resurrection reveals the sacrificial and limitless nature of that love. His love is so great that he sends his Holy Spirit, who is Wisdom itself, to be the heart and soul of his Church, to strengthen us, to give us peace, to give us understanding, and light. We know and believe all these things, and yet we know so little. It has been said that even the greatest and holiest of saints, when they walked this earth, knew very little of what there is to know about God. Jesus said to his disciples (and by extension to us), "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now." So, we walk by faith, not by sight. We trust in the Holy Church (the Mystical Body of Christ) which guides us through apostolic succession and the gift of the "Spirit of truth." Thus, we can rejoice and pray in wonder about the unfathomable truth that the Triune God cares so much for us: "Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth."

Important Roe Act Infanticide Bill Update

The Roe Act Infanticide bill could come up for a committee hearing any day now. If passed, The Roe Act would allow all of the following:

- Remove provisions requiring the giving of life saving care
 of an infant born alive after a failed abortion, legalizing
 infanticide. (With proper medical care, babies can survive).
- Eliminate the parental consent and notification system entirely, so girls as young as 12 can get abortions without any adult involvement.
- Expand late term abortion through all 9 months with no restrictions.
- Remove requirements that late term abortions be performed in hospitals (many abortion clinics do not have life-saving equipment).

Please take the time to call or write your state legislator and say "No to Roe". Help stop this bill from becoming law in our state and help preserve the sanctity of life.
