



CROSS ROADSBy Deacon Tony

Deuteronomy 30:10-14; Psalm 69:14,17,30-34,36-37; Psalm 19:8-11; Colossians 1:15-20; Luke 10:25-37

Today, Moses tells us to obey the command of God, that is to "...keep his commandments...return to the Lord... with all your heart and all your soul." There is no mystery here. It is a clear, understandable, simple and straight forward directive, already written in the deepest part of our souls which seek meaning in our lives, and communion with our God in order to be complete. The psalms tell us that even when we fall on difficult times, we are never abandoned by God. They also tell us that the commandments are a healthy way of life which refreshes our souls, imparts wisdom and joy at our deepest levels; because we were created for this. Saint Paul reminds us that Jesus is the "...image of the invisible God, that all creation was "...made through him and for him..." Yet he came to be with us and obedient to the Father to make "...peace by the blood of his cross ..." Simple, but not easy. We are called to follow that example as a way of life.

Today's gospel makes that clear. A couple of weeks ago I suggested that while we were not being asked to "abandon" family, friends, neighbors and loved ones to love God with everything we have, we were being told to love as God loves, and perhaps to expand our perspective of family and friends, even when it involves situations that are unpleasant and difficult. Today, that is said explicitly. The commandments and loving God and neighbor work together. If we truly are keeping the commandments, we are loving God with everything that we have and loving our neighbors as ourselves. We can't have one without the other. To love as God loves, we must love as Jesus (God among us) did when he walked this earth. We are all called in some fashion to carry our crosses and to help others with theirs. We walk our own cross roads, as he did; because God loves us more than any person can; and he loves us more than we even love ourselves.




Middle School Youth Group

<u>Important Roe Act Infanticide Bill Update</u>

The Roe Act Infanticide bill could come up for a committee hearing any day now. If passed, The Roe Act would allow all of the following:

- Remove provisions requiring the giving of life saving care of an infant born alive after a failed abortion, legalizing infanticide. (With proper medical care, babies can survive).
- Eliminate the parental consent and notification system entirely, so girls as young as 12 can get abortions without any adult involvement.
- Expand late term abortion through all 9 months with no restrictions.
- Remove requirements that late term abortions be performed in hospitals (many abortion clinics do not have life-saving equipment).

Please take the time to call or write your state legislator and say "No to Roe". Help stop this bill from becoming law in our state and help preserve the sanctity of life.
