There will be a holy hour of Divine Mercy **every Monday** from **6:30-7:30PM** in the lower church. All are welcome.


WEDNESDAY EVENING ROSARY

St. John's Ministry Fair

St. John's will be having a Ministry Fair at coffee hour **NEXT Sunday, September 8, from 9AM-12Noon** (after the 8AM and 10AM Masses) in the parish hall. Every volunteer ministry at St. John's will have a representative present with information about the ministry and to answer any questions. We invite all to attend, and we hope to inform, inspire, and invite all parishioners to become actively engaged in our parish life.

First Friday Masses in Honor of the Sacred Heart and Spiritual Reparation Friday, September 6 at 7PM in the Lower Church

Why?: To make reparation for our sins, the sins and failures of Church leadership; and for the sins of the world; to pray for the spiritual healing of those that have been hurt; to deepen our own relationship to Our Savior through His most Sacred Heart.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart, as we know it, began about the year 1672. On repeated occasions, Jesus appeared to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, a Visitation nun, in France, and during these apparitions He explained to her the devotion to His Sacred Heart as He wanted people to practice it. He asked to be honored in the symbol of His Heart of flesh. Our Lord asked for acts of reparation, Communion on the First Friday of the month, and the keeping of the Holy Hour.

When the Catholic Church approved the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, She did not base Her action only on the visions of Saint Margaret Mary. The Church approved the devotion on its own merits. There is only one Person in Jesus, and that Person was at the same time God and Man. His Heart, too, is Divine -- it is the Heart of God.

We will have first Friday Masses, in honor of our Lord's Most Sacred Heart, especially for the reparation of sins and sacrileges that so offend our heavenly Father: for our sins; the sins of the Church; and sins of the world. Following the Mass, we will pray the litany to Our Lord's Most Sacred Heart.

Holy Hour for the Sanctification of Priests

On the third Thursday of every month, we will be offering a Holy Hour for the Sanctification of Priests. This is something recommended by the Congregation of the Clergy and, in this our day and age, sorely needed. This secular age of ours presents some unique challenges to the Church and to Her ministerial priesthood. The current priest shortage adds to the stress that many priests feel and can be a challenge to their spiritual life and pastoral service.

Thursday of Holy Week our Lord instituted the Holy Eucharist and priesthood, it is an ideal day to pray for priests before the Blessed Sacrament. The Holy Hour will consist of: adoration; the rosary; litany and prayer of petitions; silent prayer and benediction.

"During that month I met with many holy Priests, and yet I saw that even though the sublime dignity of Priesthood raises them higher than the Angels, they are still but weak and imperfect men. If holy Priests, whom Our Lord in the Gospel calls the salt of the earth, have need of our prayers, how much more the struggling and the lukewarm?"

CROSS ROADS

Sirach 3: 17-18, 20, 28-29; Psalm 68: 4-7, 10-11; Hebrews 12: 18-19, 22-24; Luke 14: 1, 7-14

Sometimes it is easy to forget that we were born into this world to prepare ourselves for eternity with God. Humility is one of the virtues that helps us to avoid the distractions of our imperfect world and to focus on that goal. Sirach tells us today to "Humble yourself the more, the greater you are, and you will find favor with God." We know that Jesus, the image of the invisible God, was sent lovingly to us for our salvation, and to show us the way, the truth. and the life. We are called to imitate him. In this case we are called to imitate his gentle, humble, and loving heart. If we seek the admiration, recognition, and accolades of other people, we simply are trapping ourselves in inevitable disappointment and futility, because such things are temporary and fickle. And, be aware that even otherwise good and virtuous deeds can be diminished by pride and selfpromotion.

Jesus suffered a death that was humiliating in the eyes of other people. But then he was exalted by his Resurrection, Ascension, and eternal Kingship. Saint Catherine of Siena is said to have stated, "Nails were not enough to hold God...fastened on the Cross...had not love held him there." Saint Paul said in Galatians 2: 19-20, "...the life I live now is not my own...it is a life of faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." Humility helps us to concentrate on what is above, not on ourselves. By the grace of God, that is the humility and selflessness we try to emulate in order to be exalted before Him.
