Thursday of Holy Week our Lord instituted the Holy Eucharist and priesthood, it is an ideal day to pray for priests before the Blessed Sacrament. The Holy Hour will consist of: adoration; the rosary; litany and prayer of petitions; silent prayer and benediction.

Exodus 32: 7-11, 13-14; Psalm 51: 3-4, 12-13, 17, 19; 1Timothy 1: 12-17; Luke 15: 1-32

"While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him and was deeply moved. He ran out to meet him, threw his arms around his neck, and kissed him." (Luke 15:20). Do not forget those words! We need to think of them when we are tired, and discouraged by our repeated failures, or finding it difficult to forgive ourselves or others. At the behest of Moses, God relented in his anger. On the Cross, and every day in the Sacrifice of the Mass, Jesus intercedes for us. The Lord chose Paul, who humbly admits how great a sinner he was. In Psalm 51 we are assured that God will not turn away from a humble and contrite heart.

Like the father in the parable quoted above, the Lord is always searching for any sign that we are turning back toward him. God is always looking for us, and always sees us as we are meant to be, even from a long way off. No matter how much we have defiled and disfigured ourselves in body, mind, and spirit, he recognizes us, and he rushes out to greet and to embrace us when we turn back to him. We can be sure of that. Let us pray every day that we always will turn away from the false gods of this world, and toward Him. Let us pray for a humble and contrite heart, a right conscience, a firm purpose to do better, and the grace to forgive as God forgives.
