Holy Hour for the Sanctification of Priests

On the third Thursday of every month at 7PM in the lower chapel, we will be offering a Holy Hour for the Sanctification of Priests. This is something recommended by the Congregation of the Clergy and, in this our day and age, sorely needed. This secular age of ours presents some unique challenges to the Church and to Her ministerial priesthood. The current priest shortage adds to the stress that many priests feel and can be a challenge to their spiritual life and pastoral service.

Thursday of Holy Week our Lord instituted the Holy Eucharist and priesthood, it is an ideal day to pray for priests before the Blessed Sacrament. The Holy Hour will consist of: adoration; the rosary; litany and prayer of petitions; silent prayer and benediction.

CROSS ROADS

Amos 8: 4-7; Psalm 113: 1-2, 4-8; 1 Timothy 2: 1-8; Luke 16: 1-13

It has been said that the measure of a person and of a society is how they treat the least among them. We know who they are: our children, born and unborn; those who suffer in body, mind, or spirit; the poor; the hungry; the homeless; the powerless. To the extent that we try to do something to help, does what we do raise up the needy, as it is promised that the Lord will do? "He raises up the lowly from the dust...to seat them with princes" (Psalm 113: 7-8). Or do we do things that make the needy dependent on us, which deprives them of dignity, holds them back, and subjugates them. Be warned, "The Lord has sworn by the pride of Jacob: Never will I forget a thing they have done" (Amos 8:7).

Our world has been beset with false gods like riches, pride, selfishness, power, and jealousy since Eden. These things disturb the peace and tranquility which God intended for us. In short, since the fall, humanity has had a knack for creating its own problems that were not in God's plan. However, by the grace of God, the saving grace of his Son, and prayer these disturbances can be overcome. "I ask that supplications, prayers, petitions, and thanksgivings be offered for everyone...that we lead a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity...lifting up holy hands without anger or argument" 1 Timothy 2: 1-2.

Let us not squander the riches of our Master (the grace of God), like the steward who squandered his master's property in today's gospel. Although, even that steward managed to do some good for his master's debtors, and for his master, even though he slyly did so for selfish reasons. It makes me wonder, if the story were continued, whether the steward ever truly amended his ways; or if he later squandered the grace of his master's mercy and forgiveness. I dare say that there are lessons here for all of us.
