
BIBLE STUDY

LOVE AND MERCY, ST. FAUSTINA MOVIE

A new film on the life of St. Faustina Kowalska, the Polish nun whose visions of Jesus led to the Divine Mercy devotion, will have a one-night-only showing THIS Monday, October 28 at 7PM at the Regal Cinemas in Bellingham and Solomon Pond and at AMC in Framingham. In 1931, Jesus appeared to Faustina as the King of Mercy. Clothed in a white robe and emanating two large rays from his side, one white and one red, He asked Faustina to paint this image of Himself along with the phrase "Jesus, I trust in You" and to spread the message of mercy around the world. The gripping new docudrama LOVE AND MERCY presents unknown facts and recently disclosed documents that shed new light on the vision of Faustina.

LOVE LASTS FOREVER

At every Holy Mass, we enter into the timeless reality of the perfect and acceptable sacrifice of Christ to the Father for our sake. And from that sacrifice, immeasurable graces flow for all people and especially for those for whom the Mass is being offered. This is particularly the case for the faithful departed who may be undergoing purification in Purgatory to prepare them for the joy of Heaven. We can offer the Holy Souls no better comfort and solace than to attend a Mass for them, or have Masses said for them.

What is Purgatory?

"All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation, but after death they undergo purification so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of Heaven. The church gives the name purgatory to the final purification of the elect which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned."

-Catechism of the Catholic Church 1030,1031

What is All Souls Day?

All Souls Day is a special day of prayer, fasting, and sacrifices for all our brothers and sisters in Purgatory who have gone before us "marked with the sign of faith." How can we best help our brothers and sisters in Purgatory, who cannot help themselves? There will be five Holy Masses for all our brothers and sisters in Purgatory starting this Friday, November 1 at 7PM, Saturday, November 2 (All Souls Day), at 8AM and 5PM, Sunday, November 3, at 6:30PM and Monday, November 4, at 9AM here at St John's. For those who can join us, there will be a holy hour after each Mass. This is sponsored by the Helpers of the Holy Souls.

CROSS ROADS By Deacon Tony

Sirach 35: 12-14, 16-18; Psalm 34: 2-3, 17-19, 23; 2 Timothy 4: 6-8, 16-18; Luke 18: 9-14

As I write, it has been twelve days since a dear friend of mine suddenly passed away. He passed quietly while he was in the process of doing something for some-body else. If it were not for the fact that I happened to be present when he would get two or three phone calls, or for the occasions when we could not get together because of the volunteer work he was doing, I never would have known that he always was doing something for somebody else. He had that great virtue of humility, that is, he was poor in spirit. My friend did not feel the need to try to justify himself. He did his best, and he humbly spent himself in service to others. As much as anyone I have ever known I believe his was a spirit that pierced the clouds and was welcomed by the Lord.

In today's gospel, the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector demonstrates that humility is essential. The Pharisee tried to justify himself before God. In his pride, he did not realize that it is only by the gift of faith and God's mercy that we are justified. Don't be that guy. Be more like the lowly tax collector who understood reverence for God, and the need for God's mercy. Be more like Saint Paul who was "...being poured out like a libation..." Saint Paul finished the race, kept the faith, and continued to proclaim the gospel, even though he was nearing his end. Paul's words of being "poured out" are reminiscent of Christ's example of giving his all, even to the shedding of his last drops of blood and water as he died on the cross for us. Paul exemplifies giving one's all, and yet understanding that it would be God, in his mercy, who would carry him safely to his eternal reward. We strive to be poor in spirit while spending our self in service to others, in order that in some fashion we might be considered among the lowly. As Sirach tells us today, "The prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds..."
