
BIBLE STUDY

Dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory

In the Catholic Church, the month of November is traditionally given over to prayers for the holy souls. The most powerful form of prayer for the souls in purgatory is the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

PURGATORY—A MYSTERY OF LOVE

What does the church teach about Purgatory?

- 1. There is a Purgatory
- 2. The holy souls in Purgatory are in a state of grace, are assured of their eternal salvation.
- 3. They suffer to satisfy the justice of God for past sin which has been forgiven but has not been sufficiently atoned for. Rev. 21:27; Mt. 5:48
- 4. The Holy Souls in Purgatory cannot help themselves, only the faithful on earth can help to shorten their time of purification by offering up works of penance, prayer, devotions, Eucharist adoration, gaining indulgences for them, but above all having the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass offered up for them. 2Mac. 12:43-46, CCC 958: 1471-1479

CROSS ROADSBy Deacon Tony

Wisdom 11:22-12:2; Psalm 145:1-2, 8-11, 13-14; 2 Thessalonians 1:11-2:2; Luke 19:1-10

The Book of Wisdom reminds us that the God is greater than all of creation. The seemingly infinite vastness of the universe and everything in it, to God is as a "...drop of morning dew...". Yet God loves it all, including us. It all belongs to him. We belong to him. Despite our sinfulness he loves us. He is merciful, kind, and compassionate.

Jesus, God Among Us, came "...to seek and to save what was lost." Today's gospel illustrates this. Jesus is delighted that Zacchaeus climbed a tree to catch a glimpse of him. Zacchaeus turned toward Jesus; and Jesus went all out to spend time with him, to the point of staying at his house. Zacchaeus received Jesus with joy, opening his house and his heart. The crowd grumbled that Jesus was staying with a sinner, losing sight of the fact that they and all of us, to one extent or another, are sinners. Zacchaeus responds by demonstrating repentance, a willingness to do penance by giving alms, a willingness to return "four times over" as reparation to anyone he may have cheated. He was transformed, and salvation came to his house.

We are called to continue Jesus' mission to recover what was lost, which includes us. We are called to turn ever more toward Jesus, to receive Jesus into our homes and our souls with joy. We are called to confess with true repentance, penance, and a commitment always to work to change for the better. We are called to be transformed, and to help others to be transformed. We all are called, each in our own way, to be a sign of God's mercy, and of salvation.
