

<u>First Friday Masses in Honor of</u> <u>the Sacred Heart and Spiritual Reparation</u>

Friday, December 6 at 7PM in the Lower Church

Why?: To make reparation for our sins, the sins and failures of Church leadership; and for the sins of the world; to pray for the spiritual healing of those that have been hurt; to deepen our own relationship to Our Savior through His most Sacred Heart. Devotion to the Sacred Heart, as we know it, began about the year 1672. On repeated occasions, Jesus appeared to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, a Visitation nun, in France, and during these apparitions He explained to her the devotion to His Sacred Heart as He wanted people to practice it. He asked to be honored in the symbol of His Heart of flesh. Our Lord asked for acts of reparation, Communion on the First Friday of the month, and the keeping of the Holy Hour.

When the Catholic Church approved the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, She did not base Her action only on the visions of Saint Margaret Mary. The Church approved the devotion on its own merits. There is only one Person in Jesus, and that Person was at the same time God and Man. His Heart, too, is Divine -- it is the Heart of God.

We will have first Friday Masses, in honor of our Lord's Most Sacred Heart, especially for the reparation of sins and sacrileges that so offend our heavenly Father: for our sins; the sins of the Church; and sins of the world. Following the Mass, we will pray the litany to Our Lord's Most Sacred Heart.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be celebrated 8:30-9:15AM in the lower church NEXT Saturday, December 7.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament follows the 9AM Mass in the lower church every Friday, beginning with the Litany to our Blessed Mother. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is recited at 11:45AM followed by Benediction.

CROSS ROADS

Isaiah 2: 1-5; Psalm 122: 1-9; Romans 13: 11-14; Matthew 24: 37-44

Advent is suddenly upon us. It is a time of joyful yet sacrificial expectation for the commemoration of the first coming of Christ who humbled himself to live among us. In today's readings we are told to expect peace and rejoice; yet we are sternly warned in the Gospel that we must be prepared for the second coming of Christ. As we cannot separate the Manger from the shadow of the Cross, we cannot separate our preparation for Christmas from the preparation we continually do for the second coming.

I remember when my wife and I were expecting our first child. For those nine months she was being prepared for birth. Also, we were preparing for her. We cleaned out a room, got rid of things we did not need, gathered things that we would need, cleaned, redecorated etc., doing everything we needed to do to prepare for her to live with us. It did not end there. After she was born and continued to grow, we continued to prepare for the next cycle of growth; and we grew with her.

I think the readings today are telling us to be at peace, not to fear the second coming, but to prepare for it diligently and seriously. During Advent we prepare our souls to have the Christ Child reborn within us. We try to cleanse our souls, to rid ourselves of the sinful clutter and distractions occupying the darker corners of our souls, to use sacraments and sacrifice as best we can to make our souls a suitable dwelling for Christ. Paul says we must avoid excesses, and all improper behavior. We have the Church and the sacraments, instituted by Christ to help us in everything we really need to do to "put on Christ." Prepare a room in your soul for Jesus. Be not afraid of the second coming. If the Christ Child dwells within you, you will grow; and you WILL be prepared!
