WEDNESDAY EVENING ROSARY



CROSS ROADS

Isaiah 60: 1-6; Psalm 72: 1-2, 7-8, 10-13; Ephesians 3: 2-3, 5-6; Matthew 2: 1-12

Today is the Epiphany of the Lord. In its ordinary meaning an epiphany is an enlightening realization, a moment when one becomes aware of something important, something that one comes to understand from a new and deeper perspective. Today we celebrate the beginning of the realization through the Magi, that Christ came to save all people.

The Magi had to travel from their respective countries to pay homage and give gifts to Jesus; and then they had to travel to return to their countries. Where we live, most of us need not travel long distances over land and sea to be in the physical presence of Christ. At the nearest Catholic church, we can receive him in the Eucharist, and worship him in the Blessed Sacrament in repose or in vigil. Ours are life-long spiritual journeys of heart and soul that we travel by faith, not by sight. We do not follow a star. We follow Christ who is the way. We can have our own epiphany, learn to bear our crosses, and gain a better understanding of ourselves and of our relationship with Christ, from a deeper perspective.

Saint John Bosco said, "...there are two things the devil is deathly afraid of: fervent Communions and frequent visits to the Blessed Sacrament." By doing such regularly, we continue to celebrate the spirit of Christmas and of the Epiphany, we open our hearts to Christ, we give him the gift of our lives, and we can become a light that demonstrates to others where to find Christ and the profound justice and peace promised in the scriptures. We are so blessed to have Christ so easily accessible to us. Much is expected. But, how far are we willing to travel on our spiritual journeys?
