

ADVENT: Rethinking the Season

Advent is an odd season. Unlike most other seasons, it's a season that isn't about itself, but is instead about preparing for Christmas. But that reality often gets lost in the shuffle and stress of trying to find all the right gifts, decorations, and dinner ingredients. In this talk, Dr. Tim Gray uses storytelling and the readings of the Old Testament to explain that we need to live the 'pre-season' of Advent well, so we can be prepared to welcome and receive the greatest gift God the Father wants to give us at Christmas: His Son, Jesus. CROSS ROADS

Isaiah 11:1-10; Psalm 72:1-2, 7-8, 12-13, 17; Romans 15:4-9; Matthew 3:1-12

With today's worship we begin the second week of Advent. We all must assess how we are doing with our preparation for the commemoration of the Birth of Jesus. The Miriam Webster Dictionary indicates that Advent certainly is those four weeks of preparation; but uncapitalized, the word, advent, means a coming into being or use. That second meaning has relevance for us this time of year because it suggests how we should prepare ourselves during this time, and throughout the year. John the Baptist in today's gospel insists that we must repent, which requires that we also reform ourselves. By the grace of God, through the infinite merits of Jesus, we are to do the hard work of becoming something new and something better than we are now.

Isaiah speaks of the ideal king, "from the stump of Jesse" (the father of David), who is full of wisdom, understanding, counsel, strength, knowledge, fear of the Lord, and faithfulness. That King of Kings is the one for whom we prepare ourselves and strive to emulate. He brings an age of peace and justice; an end to enmity, strife, and affliction. But the Lord also works through us, and he expects, by his grace, that we bear fruit. We have the sacraments of the Eucharist and Penance to strengthen us and to keep us on track. We can fast, give alms, help to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, tend to the sick and suffering, provide company to the lonely, solace to the sorrowful, and hope to the discouraged. With the Lord as the guest of our souls we can repent, reform, work in harmony and bear much fruit. Let us begin!
