Holy Hour for the Sanctification of Priests

On the **third Thursday of every month at 7PM** in the lower chapel, we will be offering a Holy Hour for the Sanctification of Priests. This is something recommended by the Congregation of the Clergy and, in this our day and age, sorely needed. This secular age of ours presents some unique challenges to the Church and to Her ministerial priesthood. The current priest shortage adds to the stress that many priests feel and can be a challenge to their spiritual life and pastoral service.

Thursday of Holy Week our Lord instituted the Holy Eucharist and priesthood, it is an ideal day to pray for priests before the Blessed Sacrament. The Holy Hour will consist of: adoration; the rosary; litany and prayer of petitions; silent prayer and benediction.



CROSS ROADS

Isaiah 42: 1-4, 6-7; Psalm 29: 1-4, 9-10; Acts 10: 34-38; Matthew 3:13-17

Today the liturgical season of Christmas comes to an end with the Baptism of the Lord. Jesus, the Word Made Flesh, God Among Us, humbly submits himself to Baptism by John "...to fulfill all righteousness." The footnotes to today's gospel tell us that "The Baptism of Jesus is the occasion on which he is equipped for his ministry by the Holy Spirit and proclaimed to be the Son of God." As with many of the readings during the Advent and Christmas seasons, something else is revealed about God in a manner that was made discernable by the senses of those who were present: our one Trinitarian God. The Holy Spirit descends on to Jesus in the appearance and gentleness of a dove. The strong voice and word of the Father is heard saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." Then Jesus, the Son of God, the Word of God made flesh, in whom the entire Godhead is contained, begins his ministry.

The Baptism of John was meant for sinners. Yet the sinless Son of God submitted himself to it as an example to us. In our Baptisms we too were anointed by the Holy Spirit and equipped for our ministry to follow Jesus, to serve like him, to show no partiality, to bring all humanity to God through his Christ, to bring justice and healing gently to all, to be a light to the world, to open the eyes of those who are blind to the reality of God's love for all of us. We know from the gospels that this is not an easy road to travel; but it can be a joyous one if we completely and humbly give ourselves over to the Christ who completely and humbly gave himself up for us.

Free-Throw Championship

The Knights of Columbus Free-Throw Championship Competition will be held on Friday, January 24, 2020 at the Hopkinton High School after the Hopkinton/Ashland varsity boys basketball game. All boys and girls ages 9-14 can participate. The Knights of Columbus free-throw competition is an annual event sponsored by the Ashland/ Hopkinton Council (Bishop Rice council #4822). The event is open to boys and girls aged 9 to 14 in the local communities. Trophies will be presented to first and second place winners and a medal is awarded to the third-place winner in each age category. First place winners advance to the district finals. The event brings the youth of the community together in a friendly competition. Since 1972 The Knights of Columbus have sponsored a basketball free-throw competition for boys and girls between the ages of 9 and 14.
