How to Make a Spiritual Communion

Given our current restrictions, many are trying to watch Mass at home either through EWTN or CatholicTV, and when we do so we are encouraged to make a Spiritual Communion. What is that? A Spiritual Communion is a prayer professing faith in Jesus Christ's real presence in the Holy Eucharist and inviting our Savior to come live in our hearts. Begin by examining your conscience and making a good Act of Contrition. Then pray one of the prayers recommended by the saints for inviting Christ into your heart. Here is one by St. Alphonsus Liguori:

My Jesus, I believe that You are truly present in the most Blessed Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there, and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

A Spiritual Communion can never fully take the place of receiving Holy Communion at Mass, but in these extraordinary times, It can help us to stay close to our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament.

The traditional Act of Contrition: O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended thee, And I detest all my sins, because I dread the loss of heaven And the pains of hell, But most of all because they have offended thee, my God, Who art all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve with the help of Thy grace, To confess my sins, to do penance, and to amend my life. Amen.

CROSS ROADS

Acts 2: 1-11; Psalm 104: 1, 24,29-34; 1 Corinthians 12: 3-7, 12-13; John 20: 19-23

In today's reading from the gospel of John, Jesus appears to the disciples on the day of his Resurrection. His first message is "Peace be with you." His second message is one of peace and mission, "Peace be with you, as the Father has sent me, so I send you." Then he breathes on them, imparts the Holy Spirit, and gives the disciples the power to forgive sins. This is the only place in the gospels that there is an account of Jesus imparting the Holy Spirit on his disciples after the Resurrection.

However, it is only in today's reading from Acts, which is considered a sort of seguel to Luke's gospel, that we have an account of the first Pentecost. This account paints a graphic picture of the transformative power of the Holy Spirit: the noise of a strong driving wind, the tongues of fire, the urge to proclaim, and the speaking in different languages so that all understood as one to the astonishment of those who witnessed it. What a difference from the first reading from Genesis in the Pentecost Vigil Mass. That reading was about the Tower of Babel, when because of pride the people were made to speak in different languages and could not understand one another. They were no longer as one. Saint Paul puts much of this in perspective. We have no real faith without the Holy Spirit. All of us have different gifts and missions, but they all come from the same Spirit. We all are different parts of the same body as one, serving the same God (Father Son and Holy Spirit).

The disciples received the Holy Spirit, were transformed, and sent to renew the face of the earth into **one** family of God. We have received the same Spirit through Baptism, and through Confirmation (our personal Pentecost). Prayer, peace, comforting, transformation, renewal, mission, are some of what we can take away from this holy day. Let us pray as the disciples did to receive the Holy Spirit who always is available to those who ask: Come Holy Spirit and fill the hearts of your faithful. Transform us, that **as one** we can serve God and one another, and help to renew the face of the earth.
