#### **Divine Mercy Prayer Group**


There will be a holy hour of Divine Mercy **every Monday** from **6:30-7:30PM** in the lower church. All are welcome.

#### **CROSS ROADS**

Joshua 24:1-2, 15-18; Psalm 34:2-3, 16-21; Ephesians 5:21-32; John 6:60-69

Today's gospel is the last of the readings in chapter 6 of John's gospel that comprise his discourse on the Eucharist. That discourse is about the reality of the Eucharist as the real physical presence of Jesus Christ in all his humanity and divinity. It is our true source of spiritual nourishment, and the sanctifying grace that can energize our spirits. It can deliver us from the evil one, from our inevitable fears, trials, distress, and futile attachments to the things of this world. But for us to be true believers, and to benefit fully from the gift of sanctifying grace, we must humbly submit ourselves to the will of God, and to the legitimate needs of others, because that is what God does for us.

God submitted himself to us through Jesus Christ who humbled himself to share in our humanity so that we might share in his divinity; and Christ humbly submitted himself to death at the hands of humanity. God submits himself to us all the time, by allowing us to decide whether we will serve him or not. He never abandons us: but in our stubbornness he sometimes does leave us to our own devices, and to the inevitable consequences when we choose the attachments of this world, rather than choosing him. Joshua challenged the Israelites to choose who they would serve, the Lord or the false gods of the people they had conquered with the Lord's help. But Joshua added, "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." The people likewise chose to serve the Lord. Christ's teaching about the Eucharist was rejected by many, even some of his own disciples. When Christ asked the twelve if they also wanted to leave, it was Peter who said, "to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." Let us not forget the humble submission of Our Lady to the will of God and the Incarnation. Saint Paul instructs us today that submission and service to one another is to serve as Christ did.

I suspect that failure to believe in the Eucharist, or the failure to put its Sanctifying Grace fully into action, often is caused by humanity's aversion to submission in general (Satan's downfall). Even as believers, sometimes we fail to submit to serving God, and the legitimate needs of others. In its fallen nature, humanity is prone to seek the futile pleasures, and allurements of the world, as opposed to choosing a truly Christlike life of sacrificial love. To whom shall we go? Let us choose the Lord and embrace the Grace!
