<u>First Friday Mass in Honor of</u> <u>the Sacred Heart and Spiritual Reparation</u>

THIS Friday, September 3 at 7PM in the Lower Chapel

Why?: To make reparation for our sins, the sins and failures of Church leadership; and for the sins of the world; to pray for the spiritual healing of those that have been hurt; to deepen our own relationship to Our Savior through His most Sacred Heart. Devotion to the Sacred Heart, as we know it, began about the year 1672. On repeated occasions, Jesus appeared to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, a Visitation nun, in France, and during these apparitions He explained to her the devotion to His Sacred Heart as He wanted people to practice it. He asked to be honored in the symbol of His Heart of flesh. Our Lord asked for acts of reparation, Communion on the First Friday of the month, and the keeping of the Holy Hour. When the Catholic Church approved the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, She did not base Her action only on the visions of Saint Margaret Mary. The Church approved the devotion on its own merits. There is only one Person in Jesus, and that Person was at the same time God and Man. His Heart, too, is Divine -- it is the Heart of God. We will have first Friday Masses, in honor of our Lord's Most Sacred Heart, especially for the reparation of sins and sacrileges that so offend our heavenly Father: for our sins; the sins of the Church; and sins of the world. Following the Mass, we will pray the litany to Our Lord's Most Sacred Heart.

First Saturday Devotion

All are invited to attend the First Saturday Devotion **THIS** coming **Saturday at 7:15AM** in the lower chapel. The rosary will be prayed followed by the Fatima prayers and 15 minutes of private meditation, prior to the celebration of Mass at 8AM. Confession will be available following Mass.

Consecration Prayer to the Immaculate Heart of Mary

I offer you, my holy Mother Mary,
All my thoughts, all my actions,
All my prayers and acts of charity,
All my faith and good works,
All my sacrifices that I make today.
Grant me the grace to do everything in my life
With a pure intention and a desire to please God.
I consecrate myself to your Immaculate Heart,

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament follows the 9AM Mass in the lower church every Friday, beginning with the Litany to our Blessed Mother. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is recited at 11:45AM followed by Benediction.

CROSS ROADS

Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-8; Psalm 15:2-5; James 1:17-18, 21-22, 27; Mark 7: 1-8, 14-15, 21-23

The Lord's commands are the key to truth, justice, and freedom from confusion about what is right and what is wrong. They enable us to experience the fullness of a good and faithful life doing God's will. In Deuteronomy we are told, "...you shall not add to what I command you nor subtract from it." The Lord's commands are his word, and his word took on flesh and blood in the person of Jesus Christ. It is Christ who is the perfect example of how to live by doing the will of the Father. As we see in today's gospel, the Pharisees had it all wrong. They were touting human precepts, but just giving lip service to the word of God, not seeing that God's law is meant to protect us from the tendencies of our fallen nature, and to prevent the corruption of our immortal souls. The Pharisees did not take God's commands to heart as a quide to how to live and serve God and one another. James tells us, "Humbly welcome the word that has been planted in you and is able to save your souls. Be doers of the word and not bearers only...'

We live in an era of great confusion. Deception and confusion about right and wrong always have been two of Satan's main weapons. With God's commands to guide us, we allow ourselves to be free of the uncertainty and confusion planted by the Evil One in today's culture of relativism where right is made to seem wrong and a limit to our freedom; and wrong is made to seem right. One need not look further than the specious argument that killing an unborn child is a woman's right, to realize how the soul of this country is being attacked. Such sophistry is being used on almost every moral issue of our times. But when we take the Lord's commands to heart, and live by them, we become doers of the word of God, and we are freed from confusion and corruption of mind and soul. May the word of God and his commands take root in us, bring light to the dark corners of our souls, grow, and bear good fruit, that we may serve God by serving one another, especially the afflicted
