First Saturday Devotion



CROSS ROADS

Deuteronomy 6: 2-6; Psalm 18: 2-4, 47, 51; Hebrews 7: 23-28; Mark 12: 28-34

Forgive me if I borrow a term from "Star Trek," but today's readings make known and illuminate God's "prime directive." As articulated by Jesus in Mark's gospel, "Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength...You shall love your neighbor as yourself." This is a command, not a suggestion. Yet we are not to obey simply out of obligation, but we are to "take to heart, these words" because it is not simply a command. It is a way of life, the key to inner peace and joy in this largely Godless world, and the prescription for eternal life. I call it God's "prime directive" because it sums up all other commandments. True obedience to loving God with everything that we have and loving our neighbor as ourselves requires obedience to all other commandments. For instance, if we are stealing, cheating, hurting, coveting, misleading, leading others astray, or ignoring the needs of others, we are not loving our neighbor as ourselves. More than that, to obey these commands we must not just refrain from harming each other, we are called to help and encourage each other. We are called to love as God loves.

God, who is love, is so full of love that his love spills over into creation. God's love is productive, creative, generous, and salvific. His love for us is so great that he created us in his own image and likeness; and he sent his Word Incarnate, Jesus Christ to live, teach, and die, among us, and to rise from the dead to demonstrate that resurrection and eternal life can be ours. We can turn to Christ as our unblemished, perfect, and eternal high priest, who "is always able to save those who approach God through him," who is our strength, refuge, shield, salvation, stronghold, and rock. Be not afraid or discouraged. Heartfelt obedience to God's directive can enable our love to spill over to other people for the benefit of all. By the grace of God, we can help and encourage each other, thereby becoming instruments of creating an atmosphere conducive to the goal of eternal life. This is God's will. This is God's way. Let us pray once more, "Lord, conform us to your will, and conform us to your way."
