# DECEMBER 19, 2021



#### <u>CROSS ROADS</u> By Deacon Tony Micah 5: 1-4; Psalm 80: 2-3, 15-16, 18-19; Hebrews 10: 5-10; Luke 1: 39-45

It is the beginning of the final week of Advent. But it is never too late to make good use of what is left of this time of preparation. We can, prayerfully and humbly, better conform ourselves to the will and ways of God. The Word of God, who always was and always will be, and through whom all creation came to be, came to live among us and to be our Redeemer with humble beginnings in a place called Bethlehem, a place "too small to be among the clans of Judah." He accepted his mission to sacrifice his most holy Body and Blood, once for all, to wipe away the sins of humanity because HE was conformed to the will of the Father. Our Blessed Mother, a most humble person from humble beginnings, but full of grace, became the mother of the Word Incarnate, the Mother of God, by her trust in and conformity to the Word of God spoken to her by the Angel Gabriel. The Blessed Mother became the tabernacle through which the process of redemption would begin. Yet her first action was to visit and help her cousin, Elizabeth. The Blessed Mother is the perfect strictly human example of conforming to the will of God. It is never too late to practice humility, to think of others first, to be generous with our time and resources, to pray, to go to Confession, to partake in the Eucharist worthily, to make room in our hearts and souls for Christ by letting go of grudges, disappointments, frustrations, and anxieties.

I suggest that we at least pray the Rosary every day this week and try to make it, if it is not already, an ongoing practice. Praying the Rosary can crush evil and help us advance in conforming ourselves to the will of God. Father Gabriele Amorth, who was a Vatican Exorcist, once wrote about an exorcism, during which Satan spoke to him through the possessed person. Satan said, "Each Ave Maria of the Rosary is a blow to my face. If Christians knew the power of the Rosary, it would be the end of me." We too can become tabernacles of the Word of God. Let us make room in our hearts and souls for the Word of God this Christmas, so that like Mary we can be ever more conformed to God's will; and that we might bring Our Redeemer to others.
