#### St. John's Safe Environment Request (CORI Clearance)

The Archdiocese of Boston requires that all staff and volunteers complete a CORI (criminal record check) form **each year**. This form applies to all volunteers 18 years of age and older ministering to children, youth, elderly, and the disabled serving within various ministries. The requirement is that each individual completing the CORI request form come to the parish office or parish hall to have their CORI Request form **verified in person** with a government issued picture ID. Although we did not get the needed number of certified signatures, we did collect over 100,000 raw signatures! Amazing work, especially with the late start caused by the Attorney General's refusal to okay the language [on the petition]. Of course, like all of you, I am disappointed the question will not appear on the ballot. But, as Mother Teresa reminds us, "we are not called to be successful, only faithful". We have to trust that God has another Plan. He doesn't need to do things our ways."

**CROSS ROADS**

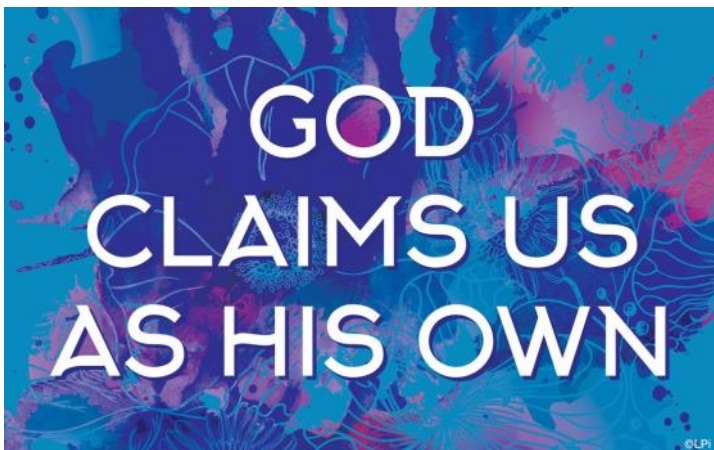

**Isaiah 40: 1-5, 9-11; Psalm 104: 1-4, 24-25, 27-30;  
Titus 2: 11-14; 3: 4-7; Luke 3: 15-16, 21-22**

As the official Christmas Season comes to an end, the Baptism of the Lord tells us something about who God is and about who we are; and what we are called to be. God is love who came to dwell among us in the person of Jesus Christ to share in our struggles, and to bring salvation. At the Baptism of the Lord, as Jesus prayed, He was anointed by the Holy Spirit who appeared in the form of a dove. Then the Father declared Jesus to be His BELOVED SON in whom He is well pleased.

By our Baptisms we too became sons and daughters of the Father and brothers and sisters to Jesus. We too were anointed by the Holy Spirit, and commissioned to grow in holiness, to go about doing good and to declare the good news. The Father shows no partiality. He sent the Son for the salvation of all people. To reach our potential as sons and daughters of the Father, we are to model ourselves after the Son, to accept the divine grace bestowed by the Holy Spirit, to love as God loves, to be temperate, just, and devout. We are to pray as Jesus did (in the very next chapter of Luke Jesus goes into the desert to pray and to be tempted). We all are called to pray for the grace to do good, to resist temptation, to face fatigue, hardship, and discouragement; and for the grace to carry our crosses.

Let us praise God for his infinite love for us. Let us praise him in prayer, by the quality of our lives, by our love and generosity toward one another, by our willingness to help each other to carry our crosses. Through it all, as Our Lord Jesus Christ never abandoned his mission. Likewise, He will never abandon us. By our Baptism we are his brothers and sisters. Even when we falter, we too are BELOVED by the Father. We must never allow discouragement to take hold of us. As the Christmas season has taught us, we are to continue to live in hopeful expectation, because even now Jesus remains with us through the Eucharist (body and blood, soul and divinity), and He will be with us always!
