

**LOVE LASTS FOREVER**



**CROSS ROADS**

**Isaiah 6:1-8; Psalm 138: 1-5, 7-8;**

**1 Corinthians 15: 1-11; Like 5: 1-11**

In today's readings we see three of the greatest men in the Holy Scriptures who, by the grace of God, were given two tremendous gifts: the grace to see themselves as God saw them; and the gift to be called and to say yes to the call. Isaiah, in a vision sees the Lord God, thinks he is doomed and is afraid, because he sees himself as "a man of unclean lips, living among a people of unclean lips." But then his lips are purified; and when the Lord asks, "Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?", Isaiah responds, "Here I am, send me." In today's gospel, the glory of Christ is revealed in the miracle that filled two boats with fish, it was Simon whose eyes were open to his own sinfulness, and who fell to his knees before Christ. Jesus responded by saying "Do not be afraid..." Then Simon (later to be called Peter), along with James and John responded to the call to be fishers of men. They dropped everything and followed Christ. Finally, Saint Paul admits to having been a persecutor of Christ and his followers. We know how he was struck down, only to be raised up by the grace of God to be the last apostle to see the risen Christ. He considered himself the least of the apostles; but he worked very hard. Chosen to bear witness, Paul zealously proclaimed the essential truth of Christianity, that Christ lived among of us, died for the forgiveness of our sins, and rose from the dead.

For us we must recognize that God knows us better than we know ourselves. He knows our strengths, our weaknesses, and our potential with the help of his grace to proclaim the word in some fashion unique to each of us. As was Simon Peter, we are urged by Christ himself to not be afraid. We all can be blind to some of our faults, but we also can be blind to our strengths, goodness, and potential. Let us pray for the grace to see both, and to say yes to whatever life we are called to live for Christ. That is what brings joy and peace whatever the obstacles and opinions of other people. Simon Peter, the one chosen to be the rock upon which Christ would build his church, would commit the sin of denying Christ. We all will fall from time to time. But we are given the graces of repentance, perseverance, and fortitude if we accept them. It is no coincidence that in the Holy Scriptures we are told to not be afraid three hundred and sixty-five times. Trust in Christ! Spread the word in whatever way you are called! Do not be afraid! Let go of anxiety and let God work in you! As somebody who is as imperfect as anyone else, I too must ponder and act on those words more fully.
