

July 11-15, 9AM-Noon, St. John's Parish Hall



CROSS ROADS

Acts 5: 12-16; Psalm 118: 2-4, 13-15, 22-24;

Revelation 1:9-13, 17-19; John 20: 19-31

Today in John's gospel we are told of two visitations to the disciples by the risen Christ. The first was in the evening on the day of his resurrection when Thomas was not present. The second was one week later when Thomas was present. In both cases the disciples were hiding in a locked room out of fear for their lives. Except for John, these were the same disciples who either denied or abandoned Jesus during his passion. Yet Jesus did not rebuke or condemn them. In the first visitation Jesus said peace be with you two times, once when he showed them his wounds, and again when commissioning them to carry on his mission, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you" and bestowing the Holy Spirit upon them and giving them the power and authority to forgive sins, thus instituting the Sacrament of Penance. When Thomas was told of all this, he would not believe until he saw for himself. In the second visitation a week later, Thomas saw for himself, and was moved to say, "My Lord and my God." That is when Jesus brings us into the scene when he says, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." But, as we shall see going forward, it would not be until after Pentecost that these disciples would venture out to proclaim and to perform the signs, wonders, and healings that are described in today's reading from Acts.

The disciples were afraid, as all of us might have been. But over time by the power of the Lord's patient mercy ("His mercy endures forever" Psalm 118), and by the power of the Holy Spirit, they would be transformed, at peace and unafraid, "Do not be afraid, I **am** the first and the last, the one who lives...forever and ever" (Revelation). Each of us is commissioned to proclaim the Word by what we say and what we do. We must believe in the miracle of Christ's Resurrection, and the power of the Lord to perform miracles big and small even now. As Saint Augustine said, "Miracles are not contrary to nature, but only contrary to what we know about nature." Only the Lord, who created all of nature, really knows. Finally, we must believe in and trust in the Lord's infinite mercy. We too can be transformed. We must not be discouraged by our weaknesses. As Brother Chris Garcia, OFM Conv, wrote, "Every saint has a past, every sinner has a future. We must be willing to let go and align ourselves with God's will."

DIVINE MERCY AND PURGATORY

The message of Divine Mercy given through the scriptures, church tradition, and the writings of Saint Faustina is a message that extends to everyone in need of God's mercy. This includes the souls in Purgatory. The spiritual works of mercy remind us that the seventh work is to "pray for the dead." There are many ways we can bring Divine Mercy into our prayer life for the souls in Purgatory.
