

St. John the Evangelist Pro-Life Initiative How to Support Life this Lent

Prayer: Say the Rosary for women in crisis pregnancies and for the legal protection of the unborn. Pray for those who advocate for life and for a change of heart of those who support abortion. Consider spiritually 'adopting' a pregnant woman and her unborn child.

Fiducia Supplicans

Fiducia Supplicans: On the Pastoral Meaning of Blessings is a Declaration issued on December 18, 2023, by the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith (DDF), formerly known as the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith (CDF). Although the declaration reaffirms the Church's teaching on marriage, the implementation of this instruction would undermine the institution of marriage as always taught to and believed by the faithful. It also would give tacit approval of sinful relationships. Most unfortunately, there is not even a call to repentance and conversion to live in accord with divine law. Over twenty episcopal conferences throughout the world have said they will not implement this declaration. Recently, ninety scholars and priests have written to the bishops asking them not to implement this declaration in their diocese and to ask the Pope to rescind this document. What the declaration says is that a couple in an irregular situation can approach a priest and ask for a blessing. They use the logic of an individual blessing, which has always been done, and apply it to couples. They state the blessing pertains only to the persons but not to their relationship. The common understanding of when a couple asks for a blessing is that it applies to their relationship as a couple. Otherwise, they would approach the priest as individuals. Furthermore, "irregular situation" is a euphemism for "gravely sinful". Thus, the document is instructing priests to bless couples in adulterous relationships, couples who are fornicating and couples violating the natural law, which also an offense against God. As the CDF stated in 2021: "God cannot bless sin." The supreme law of the Church is the salvation of souls, which is undermined by this declaration. This document affirms sinful behavior and does nothing to warn or lead people away from grave sin and it has the effect of leading others to sin. We need to pray for our Holy Father that he will rescind this confusing and heretical declaration, and clearly reaffirm the Church's moral teaching.

CROSS ROADS

Genesis 9: 8-15; Psalm 25: 4-9; 1 Peter 3: 18-22; Mark 1: 12-15

It is the first Sunday of Lent. As the Holy Spirit drove Christ into the desert to pray, fast, and to be tested for forty days, so have we now been prompted by the Holy Spirit to enter our Lenten desert to pray and be tested. Christ went to prepare for his public ministry and to stay on the path to doing his Father's will for the salvation of all. Genesis speaks of God, after the flood, promising Noah that never again shall all bodily creatures be destroyed by the water of a flood, and that there never will be another flood to destroy the earth.

God purified the earth with the waters of the great flood. It is a precursor of the new covenant by which God purifies us in the waters of Baptism in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and by Christ's life, death, and resurrection for the salvation of all. God is good! He teaches us His path. He shows us sinners the way. He guides the humble to justice and teaches the humble His way. But how do we know when we are on the right path? We know when we do as Christ did. We pray and let go of the distractions of this world, and to gain the perseverance and strength to do His will. And like Christ we will be tested and tempted to hold on to the alluring distractions of the world: attachments to the past, successes, failures, disappointments. To paraphrase the Trappist Monk, Thomas Merton, we can spend our whole life climbing the ladder of success (so called), only to find when we get to the top that our ladder is leaning against the wrong wall.

During Lent we try to do extra things to help others, and perhaps give up things that we like. But another way of putting it is that we need to totally give ourselves and our distractions over to God. He is in control, and we need to let go and let God. Why? Because Christ commanded that if anybody wants to be his disciple, one must take up his cross daily and follow Him. In the words of Sister Mary Joseph Calore, SSCJ: "In order to take up your cross daily, you will need to let go of something." Let us have a holy and fruitful Lent. Let us let go, let God, and be true disciples of Christ.
