
Please Remember in Prayer

Fiducia Supplicans

Fiducia Supplicans: On the Pastoral Meaning of Blessings is a Declaration issued on December 18, 2023, by the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith (DDF), formerly known as the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith (CDF). Although the declaration reaffirms the Church's teaching on marriage, the implementation of this instruction would undermine the institution of marriage as always taught to and believed by the faithful. It also would give tacit approval of sinful relationships. Most unfortunately, there is not even a call to repentance and conversion to live in accord with divine law. Over twenty episcopal conferences throughout the world have said they will not implement this declaration. Recently, ninety scholars and priests have written to the bishops asking them not to implement this declaration in their diocese and to ask the Pope to rescind this document. What the declaration says is that a couple in an irregular situation can approach a priest and ask for a blessing. They use the logic of an individual blessing, which has always been done, and apply it to couples. They state the blessing pertains only to the persons but not to their relationship. The common understanding of when a couple asks for a blessing is that it applies to their relationship as a couple. Otherwise, they would approach the priest as individuals. Furthermore, "irregular situation" is a euphemism for "gravely sinful". Thus, the document is instructing priests to bless couples in adulterous relationships, couples who are fornicating and couples violating the natural law, which also an offense against God. As the CDF stated in 2021: "God cannot bless sin." The supreme law of the Church is the salvation of souls, which is undermined by this declaration. This document affirms sinful behavior and does nothing to warn or lead people away from grave sin and it has the effect of leading others to sin. We need to pray for our Holy Father that he will rescind this heretical declaration, and clearly reaffirm the Church's moral teaching.

CROSS ROADS

Genesis 22:1-2, 9-13, 15-18; Psalm 116: 10, 15-19; Romans 8: 31-34; Mark 9: 2-10

In Genesis, Abraham was willing to sacrifice his only son, Isaac, as directed by God. But, because of Abraham's obedience, and trust in the Lord, as Abraham was about to slay Isaac, God stopped Abraham, and spared Isaac. This was a precursor of the Father handing over His beloved only begotten Son to carry the weight of the sins of all humanity for the salvation of all. God's infinite love for all of humanity would be poured out through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Saint Paul would say of this that as God gave up his Son for us, he also {in his infinite mercy, gives us everything we need to persevere and be saved.} "If God is for us, who can be against us?...And if God acquits us, who can condemn us?

In today's gospel, Jesus took Peter, James, and John to a high mountain where they witnessed the transfiguration, and a glorified Jesus conversing with Elijah and Moses. The three disciples were terrified when a dark cloud covered them, and a voice was heard saying, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to Him." That message is applicable to all of us. Suddenly, they again were alone with Jesus, and as they left the area Jesus directed them not to tell anyone about what happened, "except when the Son of Man had risen from the dead." The three disciples did not understand.

It would not be until Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection, that they would understand this revelation that the Messiah would not be an avenging warrior, but rather a suffering Messiah for the salvation of all. They were not perfect. Neither are we. Similarly, it sometimes takes us awhile to understand that to be a true disciple, we too must give ourselves up: time, energy, and resources with a trust like that of Abraham, to emulate Christ, to help each other, to accept our own trials and misfortunes, to persevere; and to accept the fact that the love of God is the only thing upon which we can truly rely!
