The Stations of the Cross

The Stations of the Cross, also known as the Way of the Cross or Via Crucis, commemorate Jesus' passion and death on the cross. There are 14 stations that each depict a moment on Our Lord's journey to Calvary, usually through sacred art, prayers, and reflections. The practice began as pious pilgrims traced His path through Jerusalem on the Via Dolorosa. This holy devotion was practiced as early as the days of the Emperor Constantine.

No one, however weak, is denied a share in the victory of the cross. No one is beyond the help of the prayer of Christ. His prayer brought benefit to the multitude that raged against him. How much more does it bring to those who turn to him in repentance.

St. John the Evangelist Pro-Life Initiative The Abortion Pill is Coming to Town

On Friday, March 1st, 2024, CVS and Walgreens announced they will begin selling the abortion pills, mifepristone and misoprostol, in Massachusetts. Though pills will require a prescription, and the chains said they will not be available via mail order, it is well known that chemical abortion poses greater risks for women than surgical procedures. According to the Charlotte Lozier Institute, up to one in five women will experience complications. In 2022, 9,276 unborn children died in chemical abortions across Massachusetts; more than half of all abortions in the state. The United States Supreme Court will hear oral arguments later this month on mifepristone safety provisions removed by the FDA in 2016 and 2021.



CROSS ROADS By Deacon Tony 2 Chronicles 36: 14-16, 19-23; Psalm 137: 1-6; Ephesians 2: 4-10; John 3: 14-21

As today's reading from Chronicles describes, there was a time in Judah when it's inhabitants, leaders and priests were not faithful to God and his ways. Instead, they adopted the practices of the nations. They "added infidelity to infidelity," They practiced all kinds of abominations, and desecrated the Lord's Temple. In his compassion the Lord sent the prophets as messengers to warn them, and to change their hearts. But they did not listen. They ridiculed the prophets and went about basking themselves in darkness and corruption. In so doing, they condemned themselves. Instead of opening their hearts to the Lord's compassion and light, they opened themselves to invasion, destruction, death, and seventy years of captivity in Baby-Ion. When Persia came to rule, King Cyrus was prompted by the Lord to let the people return to Judah. And Cyrus was prompted to build a temple for the Lord. I don't know about you but some of this sounds like the world we live in today, even in our country: immorality, abortion, human trafficking, the abuse of children, abomination after abomination.

It is Laetare Sunday (Laetare meaning rejoice). After reading the above, one might wonder, "what is there to rejoice about?" We can rejoice because we still have three weeks of Lent to do the things that will open our hearts to the Lord's promptings. We can rejoice that God gave his Only begotten Son, not to condemn us, but to save us while we were still prisoners to our own sinfulness. But we are required to open our hearts to receive and follow the promptings of the Lord, to let go of darkness and to accept the light. Otherwise, we end up condemning ourselves. Rejoice because of these words contained in Psalm 103: "Bless the Lord ... who pardons all your sins ... who redeems your life from the pit and crowns you with mercy and compassion...As far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our sins from us." In these remaining three weeks, look up, open your hearts to the promptings of the Lord. If your heart is already opened, open it wider. Pray, listen, and accept the Light!
