OUR LADY OF LOURDES

Our Blessed Mother appeared 18 times to Saint Bernadette Soubirous beginning on February 11 and ending July 16, 1858. On the apparition of February 24, Mary asked Bernadette for **penance and prayer for the conversion of sinners.** During the season of Lent, our Blessed Mother invites us all to do both.

Our Lady of Fatima—Mother Knows Best

The Blessed Mother appeared to three shepherd children, Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco, on May 13, 1917, to request a favor from them. Our Lady asked "are you willing to offer yourself to God and bear all the suffering He wills to send you as an act of reparation for the sins by which He is offended and of supplication for the conversion of sinners?"

CROSS ROADS By Deacon Tony Exodus 20: 1-17; Psalm 19: 8-11; 1Corinthians 1:22-25; John 2: 13-25

In today's reading from Exodus, God delivers his commandments. They are not suggestions. They are commands. Jesus, who the church teaches is the sign of the power and wisdom of God, taught that if we are to love him, we must keep his commands. In other words, the true measure of whether we love God or not is whether we obey the Lord's commandments. Psalm 19 assures us that the Lord's commands are perfect, trustworthy, right, clear, enlightening, and "more precious than gold." They lead us to true freedom from slavery to sin, bad habits, harmful memories, old and new resentments, and from evil in general. They are the spiritual GPS to the eternal joy of salvation. They highlight obedience to the Lord; and they remind us that the Lord is always wiser and stronger than we are!

In today's gospel, Jesus expels the money changers and merchants from the temple, his Father's House. They were supposed to be in the courtyard, not in the temple. Also, many of them were greedy enough to cheat pilgrims who had come to Jerusalem to worship and offer sacrifice. The scene was dramatic and chaotic, unlike the humble, comforting, healing, and forgiving Jesus. But Jesus was upholding the sacredness of his Father's House, and in fact saving the money changers and merchants from committing further sacrilege. When challenged Jesus revealed himself, and his mission, though he did so in a manner that the challengers misunderstood: "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." Jesus was referring to the MOST holy temple of God...his own body, a concept that the challengers could not begin to fathom, because they were prisoners of avarice and sacrilege.

It is the Third Sunday of Lent. How are we doing? There are times when many of us (and I include myself) may not have done as much as we should. But when we fall, we can do what Jesus did! In contemplating the Stations of the Cross, we observe Jesus, in his pain and suffering, fall three times. Two times he got up and resumed carrying his cross. And once he accepted help to stand and to carry his cross. So do not be discouraged. Simply get up, and do the will of God by keeping the Lord's commands. Help each other; and accept the help and encouragement of others to bear our personal burdens. Go to confession to stay on track. Receive the Eucharist frequently to consume the Spiritual nourishment we need to stay strong and to persevere.
