#### **Monday Zoom Rosary**



## Holy Hour for the Sanctification of Priests April 18 at 7PM

On the third Thursday of every month at 7PM in the lower chapel, we will be offering a Holy Hour for the Sanctification of Priests. This is something recommended by the Congregation of the Clergy and, in this our day and age, sorely needed. This secular age of ours presents some unique challenges to the Church and to Her ministerial priesthood. The current priest shortage adds to the stress that many priests feel and can be a challenge to their spiritual life and pastoral service. Thursday of Holy Week our Lord instituted the Holy Eucharist and priesthood, it is an ideal day to pray for priests before the Blessed Sacrament. The Holy Hour will consist of: adoration; the rosary; litany and prayer of petitions; silent prayer and benediction. "During that month I met with many holy Priests, and yet I saw that even though the sublime dignity of Priesthood raises them higher than the Angels, they are still but weak and imperfect men. If holy Priests, whom Our Lord in the Gospel calls the salt of the earth, have need of our prayers, how much more the struggling and the lukewarm?"


#### CROSS ROADS

Acts 3: 13-15, 17-19; Psalm 4: 2,4, 7-9;
1 John 2: 1-5; Luke 24: 35-48

The two disciples that encountered Jesus on the road to Emmaus, and who recognized Jesus at the breaking of the bread, ran back to Jerusalem to inform the eleven of their experience. As the two disciples were speaking to them, Jesus was suddenly in their midst, again with the greeting of "Peace be with you." But they all were startled and terrified. Once again, Jesus showed them his wounds, demonstrating that it was He among them in the flesh. But they all were "incredulous for joy and were amazed." To accentuate his point, Jesus asked for something to eat. He accepted a piece of baked fish and ate it. Then he opened their minds to what he had been telling them in the past, the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms. Jesus made it clear that he was the fulfillment of what had been written about the Messiah: "that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem."

It was Peter who we see in today's reading form Acts, who began to answer that call, preaching the good news of salvation and the need for repentance. Yet, we will see in the Sunday readings of the Easter season that the apostles still had much to learn and to understand; and that it would not be until Pentecost that they would really begin to grasp the enormity of the message and their mission. They had faith, but what they were witnessing was, and to some people to this day, incomprehensible.

In our age there are many with faith who keep the Lord's commandments and come to know Him. But there are others who lack faith, do not keep the Lord's commandments, and do not know Him. These days it is difficult to live and nurture faith in a world of selfishness, immorality, amorality, violence, and persecution: persecution against our Jewish brethren, against Christians, particularly persecution against Catholics who profess and hold dear the sanctity of life and the apostolic traditions of passing on the word of God through the ages. Laws can help. But faith that changes hearts is the key! Saint Thomas Aquinas said, "To one who has faith, no explanation is necessary. To one without faith, no explanation is possible." It is our call to be examples of the power of faith!
