

Divine Mercy Sunday

The Sunday in the octave of Easter is Mercy Sunday established by Pope John Paul II, on April 30, in the Jubilee Year of 2000, and is to be observed by the universal Church. The schedule for Mercy Sunday, **Sunday, April 7, 2024**, in the afternoon at St. John's will be as follows:

1:30 PM Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament followed by the rosary.

2:00 PM Confessions will be heard.

2:30 PM Readings from the diary of St. Faustina will be proclaimed.

3:00 PM The Divine Mercy Chaplet will be chanted.

3:30 PM Benediction and Final Blessing.

Divine Mercy Sunday

On the Sunday after Easter, the entire Catholic Church is called to gather throughout the world to celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. This beautiful devotion led Pope John Paul II on April 30, 2000, on the occasion of the canonization of St. Faustina, to officially designate the Sunday after Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday in the Roman liturgical calendar. From Saint Faustina's diary, it is clear that this Octave Day of Easter is a day chosen by Christ as a day of extraordinary graces—a complete outpouring of His mercy upon all who approach Him with great trust and expectant faith. On April 22, 2001, one year after establishing Divine Mercy Sunday, Pope John Paul II re-emphasized its message quoting St. Faustina: "Jesus said to St. Faustina one day: 'Humanity will never find peace until it turns with trust to Divine Mercy.' Divine Mercy! This is the Easter gift that the Church receives from the risen Christ and offers to humanity." The words of Jesus to Saint Faustina: "My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of my tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My Mercy. The souls that will go to confession and receive holy communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come forth from the very depths of my most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The feast of mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is my desire that it will be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the fount of My mercy."

CROSS ROADS

Acts 4: 32-35; Psalm 118: 2-4, 13-15, 22-24; 1 John 5: 1-6; John 20: 19=31

Today is both the second Sunday of Easter, and fittingly Divine Mercy Sunday. All the readings lead us to the principle of living and serving with a heart like Jesus, and his loving mercy. In Acts we see early Christians caring for one another, a community which shared so that everyone could have what they needed. They were united in the Spirit. But being united in the Spirit is more than sharing food, land, and money. More importantly it is sharing and living Faith in the loving mercy of God. That mercy overflows and is showered upon us from the Godhead, through and because of the life, death and resurrection of Christ. That common belief strengthens us to love one another as the adopted children of God, as brothers and sisters in Christ; and living accordingly by keeping the Lord's commandments.

But we all have our fears. The Apostles locked themselves in a room for fear of the Jewish authorities. Yet on the evening of the Resurrection. Jesus entered the room, twice offered them peace, breathed on them to impart the Spirit on them and to give them the authority to forgive sins. These are men, most of whom abandoned or denied Jesus. But here were no rebukes, just loving mercy. It so happened that Thomas was not there that evening. When told of the risen Jesus, Thomas could not bring himself to believe. He needed proof. A week later Jesus appeared in the locked room and Jesus gave Thomas that proof. The so-called doubter was then prompted to proclaim, "My Lord and my God!" Thomas loved and believed Jesus as much as anyone. Some commentators say that he was a very logical person, a planner, somebody who avoided unnecessary risk. When Jesus wanted to go back to Judea after the death of Lazarus, it was Thomas who argued against going there. But, submitting to the will of Jesus, Thomas basically said let us go and die with him.

It was not so much that Thomas lacked faith. After the death of Jesus, it has been said that Thomas' heart was broken. His demanding proof was more of a defense mechanism for fear of his heart being broken again. We all have a little of that in us. In this scene, Jesus was mindful of us: "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." The grammar suggests present tense. It is as if Jesus is putting us in the room. The Lord's loving forgiveness is available to all who accept it. Fear not. Trust in Jesus and his mercy always. Accept the peace of mind that He offers us!
